The Weather

Today: Sunny, with a high near 78. Calm wind will come in from the southeast at 5mph.

The Lampasas Badger Baseball team faced-off against the Marble Falls Mustangs last night, April 7th, and lost their first district game. The loss brings their district record to 8-1 and their overall record to 15-5-4.



Momentum was key. Marble Falls put up 4 on the Badgers in the 1st inning off some bad breaks of the ball. **The Badgers didn't regain momentum until the 6th inning.** Jonathan Bowling was 2-4. Peyton Sisson, Corbin Kepler, Anthony Dimas, and Drew Davis all had hits. Dimas had a double and 2 RBI's, Kepler had another RBI. **Calum Mitchell pitched 5 innings,** 9 hits, 7 R, 5 ER, and 5K's. Devin Sahr pitched 1 inning, 1 hit, 0 R, and 1 K.

The Badgers will have a home game against the Mustangs on Friday, April 10th, at 7pm.

Last night, April 7th, the Lady Badgers 17-12 overall & 5-5 in district play hit the road to Taylor to face the Ducks 9-16 & 2-7 on the pond.



Brooklyn Farmer was on the mound, as usual, and pitched a gem. She and the defense gave up only 1 run all night. The Badgers were down 1-0 early but tied it up at 1 in the 4th inning. In the 5th inning Badger catcher Madison Magilky created the necessary distance **by smacking a "Badger Bomb" over the centerfield wall** for a 3 run blast to give the Badgers a 4-1 lead. Rail Lines Now Active

The Central Texas and Colorado River Railway is now active in Lampasas and San Saba Counties. Freight trains do not travel at fixed times, so you can always expect a train.



Did you know they created the game Dumb Ways to Die to promote train safety? It applies in this case. Stay off the rail roads!

Nowadays, modern trains do not always produce a "clackety-clack" noise and are very quiet. The absence of noise puts your life at risk if you venture onto the tracks. Only cross train tracks at designated pedestrian or roadway crossings and obey warning signs. **Keep from texting, using headphones, or other distractions while around the tracks.**

The average freight train travelling at 55mph needs around 18 football field lengths to stop. They will NOT stop in time to spare your life. The average locomotive weighs 400,000 pounds or 200 tons and can weigh up to 6,000 tons. This makes the weight ratio of a car to a train proportional to that of a soda can to a car.

Stay off of railroad property! It is illegal to trespass onto the tracks. Always assume railroad tracks are being used, even if weeds are growing and the track looks unused -- *similar to how you should always treat a gun as if it is loaded.*

License Plate Recognition Cams

San Saba County Sheriff's Office addressed concerns about Flock Safety Cameras in the area. They stated that the county implemented Flock Safety Cameras to assist law enforcement. These cameras were obtained through a grant that covered 80% of the cost.



Flock Cameras are designed to capture basic vehicle information, not people, and are used to help locate stolen vehicles, assist in investigations, and support missing person cases, **according to the San Saba Sheriff's Office.**

Important things to understand: the cameras capture vehicle and license plate information, does not use facial recognition tech, are not used for real-time tracking or monitoring individuals, and are used as a tool during investigations, not continuous monitoring.

"We understand there may be questions, and we believe it's important to have open conversations," The Sheriff's Office stated in a post on Facebook. "Over the next few weeks, we'll be sharing more information about how this system works and how it's being used responsibly in our community, with safeguards in place."
