At the Tuesday night game against Brownwood it was a pitcher's duel, however, Ace Whitehead did get his first home run over-the-fence.

The Badgers head to Brownwood tomorrow night for the 3rd meeting with the Lions. Coach Evans said the team may see a different pitcher from Brownwood.

have yet to see an extra dime from the more than \$19 billion in federal stimulus money given to the state. After Congress passed the first stimulus bill last year, officials used the state's \$1.3 billion education share to fill other holes in the state budget, leaving public schools with few additional resources to pay for the costs of the pandemic.

Now, educators and advocacy groups worry that the state could do the same thing with the remaining \$17.9 billion in funding for Texas public schools from the other two stimulus packages.

Because of federal requirements, Texas has to invest over \$1 billion of the state's own budget in higher education to receive the third round of stimulus funding for K-12 public schools. Experts said the state has applied for a waiver to avoid sending that added money to higher education, but the process has caused major delays in local districts receiving funds they desperately need.

Because of the state's waiver request, Texas lawmakers likely will not decide how to parcel out the money until they either hear back from Washington D.C., or until the Legislature finalizes its plans for the state budget. But the waiver only applies to the latest stimulus package, so the state could unlock \$5.5 billion for education from the second relief bill at any time.

Many Texas teachers and administrators say they need money now, but state lawmakers holding the most power over budgeting and education funding want the Legislature, instead of local school districts, to decide what to do with these federal stimulus dollars.

Some districts have plans to move those dollars toward mental health support services that students will need while transitioning back to in-person learning this coming fall. Many districts across Texas have struggled to engage students this year, and many students have simply stopped attending online classes.

Last week, the House Appropriations Committee adopted a minor change to the state budget demanding that no stimulus education funds "shall be used to reduce state funding for local education agencies." Adding that language to the budget offered a key win for Texas education advocates, but the state senate declined to include almost all of the nearly \$18 billion in federal funds for Texas public schools in the new version of the budget that it passed Tuesday afternoon.

Sales Tax Rebate Checks

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced today he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts 677.3 million in local sales tax allocations for April, 3.5 percent less than in April 2020. These allocations are based on sales made in February by businesses.

In our area, Evant in Hamilton County saw their rebate check increase by 33.44%, with a \$3852.73 rebate, last year the rebate for Evant for this time period was \$2887.18. The city of Hamilton in Hamilton County saw a 1.19% decrease in their rebate check of \$44,537.07.

In Lampasas County, all cities saw increases; Lometa received a rebate check for \$ 6120.61, a 8.38% increase. Kempner received a rebate for \$9068.82, a 9.4% increase, while the City of Lampasas saw a 5.97% increase in sales tax rebates, for a total of \$157,398.33.
