City Council to Meet

The Lampasas City Council will meet Monday April 10th for regularly scheduled meetings.

The Workshop Session will begin at 5:30pm and the agenda includes discussion about the Solar Eclipse Town Hall Meeting and discussion regarding Department Certification Pay.

Combating the Fentanyl Crisis in Texas

Governor Greg Abbott this week announced two major statewide initiatives to combat the growing national fentanyl crisis and save innocent lives in Texas during his One Pill Kills Summit in Austin. During a press conference following panel discussions, the Governor unveiled a new \$10 million multimedia awareness initiative through the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) to educate Texans on how to prevent, recognize, and reverse fentanyl poisonings as part of the statewide "One Pill Kills" campaign. The Governor also announced the plan to distribute Naloxone (NARCAN) to all 254 Texas counties by the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM).

Fentanyl, a synthetic opioid, is the leading killer of Americans between the ages of 18-45. Last year, more than 2,000 lives were lost to fentanyl in Texas. According to provisional data from the Texas Department of State Health Services, Texas has experienced a 500% increase in fentanyl-related deaths since 2019. Under Operation Lone Star, Texas law enforcement alone has seized over 380 million lethal doses of fentanyl since 2021—enough to kill every man, woman, and child in America.

The announcement of statewide distribution of NARCAN, a nasal medication that rapidly reverses opioid poisonings, comes after several opioid manufacturers entered into a legal settlement with the State of Texas, thanks to the efforts by the Office of the Attorney General of Texas. A portion of the settlement allocates NARCAN to the State of Texas to support communities in fighting the opioid crisis. TDEM will circulate the allotments of NARCAN and will soon begin distributing the first 20,000 units to county sheriffs' offices across the state. Each of Texas' 254 county sheriff's offices will be eligible to receive a portion of this first allotment based on county population and size. TDEM is notifying all 254 sheriffs of the upcoming distribution, and each may request that county's initial allotment through the State of Texas Assistance Request (STAR) process.
