The Weather

Meetings Today

The Lampasas City Council will hold a workshop session today at 5:30pm, and a regular meeting at 6pm. which will be aired on several streaming sites. The links will be available via the city webpage, as the public cannot attend due to social distancing. The workshop session agenda includes discussion regarding impact to local businesses due to COVID-19, and any item on the regular agenda.

The Regular Session will begin at 6pm. The agenda includes the consent agenda, discussion regarding purchases and charges in excess of \$4000 in the month of March 2020. Possible action on the curfew for minors ordinance, and also on postponing the general election to November 3rd.

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court had a regular meeting this morning at 9am in the Lampasas County courthouse. The public could not attend the meeting but it was available via ZOOM online. The agenda included the consent agenda, accounts payable, partial closure of CR 2773, award bid gas & diesel, the TxDOT county transportation infrastructure fund, an amendment to Lampasas County Policy, and of course the Jail Project.



Texas Governor Extends Disaster Declaration



On Easter Sunday, April 12th, Texas Governor Greg Abbott extended his Disaster Declaration for the State of Texas. This from the Governor's office on Sunday, April 12th;

"Governor Greg Abbott today issued a proclamation extending his Disaster Declaration for all Texas counties in response to COVID-19. Originally issued on March 13th, the Disaster

Declaration provides the state a number of resources to effectively serve Texans as the Lone Star State continues to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

"By extending my Disaster Declaration, we are ensuring the state of Texas continues to have adequate resources and capabilities to support our communities and protect public health," said Governor Abbott. "I urge all Texans to continue practicing social distancing and abide by the guidelines laid out by the CDC and my Executive Orders to slow the spread of COVID-19." Governor Abbott's office stated that Disaster Declarations are effective for 30 days.

Governor Abbott will be having a press conference at 11:30am today to announce new Small Business Initiatives. It will be aired on KACQ 101.9fm.

Coronavirus Numbers

There was some confusion Friday and Saturday about the number of cases that were confirmed in Lampasas County. Some news sites were or are reporting 3 and some are reporting 2. Lampasas Radio confirmed with the County Health Authority on Saturday morning that there are only 2 cases in our county. The 3rd case is over the county line in an adjoining county. According to the state website, Bell County has 101 cases with 3 deaths. Coryell County has 34 cases., and Burnet County has 6 cases. According to the State of Texas Dept. of Health website, 13,484 Texans have tested positive for COVID-19, with 923 cases being confirmed on Sunday.

There have been 271 deaths attributed to the virus in Texas, and according to the The Texas Tribune 1,338 Texas remain hospitalized due to the coronavirus.



Car Registration Extended



Governor Abbott in March granted a temporary extension to anyone needing a new registration, or to renew the registration on their vehicle. This came on the heels of the first Disaster Declaration in March. This was on the

Texas DPS website:

"Governor Abbott also issued a statement on March 16, 2020, granting a temporary extension to obtain initial registrations and the renewal of registrations. Per TxDMV, this temporary waiver will remain in effect until 60 days after TxDMV notifies the public that normal vehicle registration, vehicle titling and related services have resumed. The 60-day period will be the same for all counties. For this reason, even if your registration will be expiring in the near future, it is not necessary to have your vehicle inspected until after TxDMV notifies the public that normal registration and related services have resumed.
