The main weather story this week is the below-normal temperatures. The abundant sunshine today should allow highs to warm into the 60's. City Manager Notes.

Finley de Graffenreid was in the Lampasas Radio studios this morning for his weekly show with Ronnie Witcher.

Last week, Mr. Witcher and Mr. de Graffenreid talked about the enormous financial and economic strain on the city residents from the closure of local schools and businesses.

At the city council meeting Monday night, the city began researching 2 different plans to see "What we can do for some of the businesses that have been forced to close their doors", and to help with some of their expenses. The city manager states that chapter 380 of the local government code allows cities to provide grants to businesses. The City Council is looking into how the city can assist shuttered businesses with their expenses, utilities and rent and such. Also, the businesses that are staying open, there is much less activity so sales are down. The Lampasas Economic Development Corp. is looking into how the city can help with funding these businesses, which will not be based so much on expenses such as utilities. Some type of a "bridge" loan, to help local businesses get back on their feet, and stay open. Mr. de Graffenreid stated that the Lampasas EDC will meet today at noon. The city council and EDC hope to have more information in the next few weeks.

The City of Lampasas will also receive less sales tax rebates, due to the shutdown of the state's economy, and the Golf Course being closed also means less income.

He also states that in order for businesses to reopen, there needs to be a quick-test/quick-isolation protocol in place.

For those that have issues with the utility bills, residents are advised to call city hall and make arrangements for the bill. There are several different ways they can accommodate people for their utility bill.





Home Delivered Meals for Seniors

The following is a press release from Governor Greg Abbott, and forwarded by County Judge Randall Hoyer.

Governor Greg Abbott announced on March 25, 2020 that Texas has received a \$16.2 million grant from the Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Administration for Community Living (ACL) to help communities provide meals for older adults. The grant was part of a \$250 million dollar outlay authorized by the Families First Coronavirus Response Act, signed into law by President Trump on March 18, 2020. Originally created by the Older Americans Act (OAA) of 1965, these programs provide meals to more than 2.4 million older adults nationwide each year, both through home delivery and in places like community centers. Funding in the amount \$304,295 was allocated to the Central Texas Area Agencies on Aging for seniors residing in Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties. The home delivered meals are for seniors age 60 and older impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
