The Weather



The high yesterday 76° This morning's low 68°

Today: Look for partly sunny skies and a high temperature near 82°. There will be S wind near 10-15 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly cloudy skies and the low temperature will dip to near 66°. Wind will be S at 15-20 mph with possible gusts of 25 mph.

Thursday: Look for clouds in the morning with gradual clearing and a high temperature near 84°. There is a 70% chance of precipitation. Wind will be S-SW near 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

In Lampasas Radio Studios

Lampasas Assistant City Manager Ryan Ward joined Ronnie Witcher in Lampasas Radio Studios this morning.

They visited at length about the City's Capital Improvement Projects (CIP). Mr. Ward shared that the CIP funding can include money for parks, roads and large equipment purchases to name a few things. The Capital Improvements Program Committee, according to Mr. Ward, works with the City to prioritize where the money should be spent and where it has the biggest impact on the community. Mr. Ward shared that this is 'budget season' and the people involved will refocus their efforts to address issues that need attention, and he also said for citizens to reach out with ideas for the CIP program by calling their City Council Member or City Hall.

Mr. Ward said that the city is trying to get grant funding for the northwest part of the city from Porter St. to Key Ave. for drainage issues in that area, and have been doing surveys in those neighborhoods for input from the residents.

The Hostess House rehabilitation project is on hold, and the venue is not available for use. The City will discuss changing the scope of the project and hopes to have it out for bid over the summer. The highest priority will be addressing the code deficiencies.

The City Council will be looking toward summer and the impacts on electric and water rates and having discussions about that.

For interested residents, the Lampasas Economic Development Corp. meets tonight at 5:30pm and the Parks Board meets tomorrow night at 6pm at the Calvert Building..

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on April 14th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 44 cases were brought to the court with 33 cases involving men and 11 cases involving women. Robert Baker failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram.

There were 14 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 8 cases for possession less than a gram, with 1 in a drug free zone. There were 4 cases for possession of 1-4 grams. There was 1 case for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance PG1/less than a gram/in a drug free zone, and 1 case for manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams. There was 1 case for possession of a controlled substance PG2 less than a gram. There were 2 DWI cases.

There were 4 burglary cases and 3 cases for bail jumping/failure to appear. There were 2 cases each for fraud and criminal mischief w/intent to impair/interrupt a public service. There was 1 case each for evading arrest, fraud/intent to obtain controlled substance/schedule I or II, engaging in organized criminal activity and prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

In crimes involving personal harm, there were 2 cases for assault of a public servant. There was 1 case each for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, and assault of a family member.

In other cases there were 5 cases of possession w/intent to promote child pornography. There were 2 cases for continuous sexual abuse of a child under 14 years of age, and 1 case of indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 56 cases, 14 were settled with Jordon Williams of Killeen sentenced to 5 years probation plus court costs on the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1 less than a gram. On the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1 1-4 grams Todd Wimberly saw his probation continued with the sanction of drug treatment. Jessica Helgesson plead guilty and was sentenced on 2 charges, assaulting a public servant and burglary of a habitation; Ms. Helgesson received 10 years (*cont'd on back*)

(cont'd from front) TDCJ w/10 years probated w/ SAFPF as a stipulation, plus court costs on each charge and a \$2000 fine for the burglary charge. There were 2 cases of criminal mischief w/intent to impair/interrupt a public service, Jesse Ramsey Jr. saw his charge reduced to a misdemeanor and was sentenced to 5 days in the county jail with credit for 5 days plus court costs and a \$100 fine; on the same charge, Brandy Westberry saw her case dismissed. Pamela Garcia plead guilty to aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, saw her probation adjudicated and was sentenced to 4 years TDCJ w/credit for days served.

Tracy Davis of Kempner plead guilty to 5 counts of possession w/intent to promote child pornography and was sentenced to 12 years in TDCJ for each count. On the charge of indecency with a child/sexual contact he plead guilty and was sentenced to 15 years TDCJ, and on the charge of continuous sexual abuse of a child under 14, Mr. Davis was sentenced to 50 years in TDCJ.

All other cases were reset or were set for jury trials.

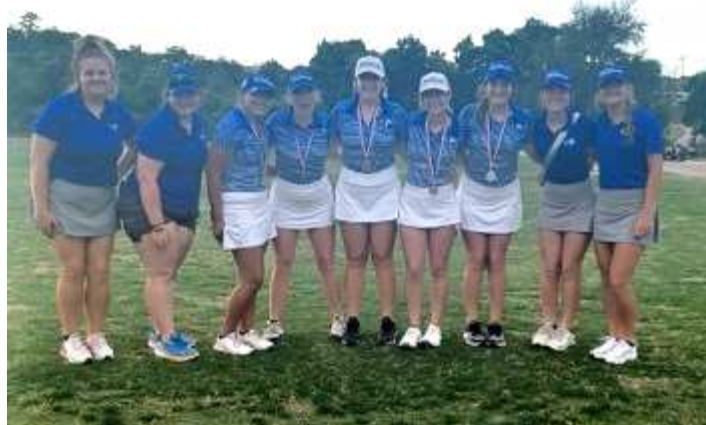
The Lady Badger Varsity was in Jarrell last night where they took a hard loss 5-6.
