The Weather

The High yesterday 82° The Low this morning 67° Residents are advised to stay weather aware today as the potential for strong or severe storms increases. The highest threat for severe weather is closer to and east of I-35, but as a dryline advances toward and through Central Texas today storms are possible anywhere. After the storms, dry air will move into the region making for a quiet night. Lows will be in the 50's and 60's with clearing skies. Friday will see another cold front moving

through our area bringing a 5-10 degree temperature drop, and winds will shift to the MW at 15-25 mph making for a windy Friday.

Today: There is an 80% chance of showers an storms this morning, with chances decreasing beginning in the early afternoon. The high temperature will be near 84° and S-SE winds at 10-15 mph becoming SW in the afternoon possibly gusting to 25 mph.

Tonight: Mostly clear with a low near 57°, and an W-SW wind at 5-10 mph becoming NW overnight.

Thursday: Sunny with a high near 83°. The wind will be W-NW at 5-10 mph becoming NE in the afternoon.

Thursday Night: A low near 62° with clear skies. Wind will be light out of the SE.

From Judge Randy Hoyer

The following was released by Judge Hoyer yesterday;

"Lampasas County - Today at 1:30pm, County Judge Randy Hoyer held an **Emergency Called Commissioner's Court** Meeting to discuss Governor Abbott's most recent Executive Orders 15, 16, and 17 pertaining to COVID-19.



Hoyer stated that the new state-wide orders were going to be implemented in a rolling schedule over the next few weeks with more orders to follow as recommendations from the Governor's Strike Force to Open Texas come in. Hoyer explained that while the County could adopt more restrictive orders, the County, her citizens, visitors, businesses and organizations of all types, must adhere to the Governor's Orders. The County adopted a Shelter in Place Order prior to the Governor issuing a state wide Shelter in Place Order. There is no longer a need for the County to maintain a Shelter in Place Order since we are all now following directives from the Governor, Hoyer said. Another concerned expressed by the Judge if the County were to continue a Shelter in Place Order, is the need to amend the order to reflect the Executive Orders as new orders are issued out of the Governor's office. With the information provided, the Commissioner's Court took action to rescind the Lampasas County Amended Stay Home Stay Safe Order dated April 7, 2020.



District Court Notes

Lampasas Courthouses was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on April 17th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 6 cases were brought to court, and all of them involved men. There were 2 cases of possession of a controlled substance, on e for less than a gram, and one for 2-400 grams. There was 1 credit/debit card abuse case, one for evading arrest with a vehicle, one for burglary of a habitation, and one for murder.

Of the 6 cases presented to the court, 2 were resolved, and one defendant for 2 cases was given a PR Bond. John West of Lampasas, on the charges of debit/credit card abuse and manufacture/delivery of a controlled substance 4-200 grams had his bond reduced to \$4000 and a PR bond was approved for him. Zachariah Sanchez of Lampasas, plead guilty to burglary of a habitation and was sentenced to 2 years TDCJ with credit for days served. Dalton Steele, on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, saw his probation adjudicated and was sentenced to 20 months in state jail with credit for days served.

The balance of the cases were reset of had trials scheduled for a future date.
