Social Distancing & Retail To Go

Dr. Georgia Hay, Lampasas County Health Authority was in the Lampasas Radio Studios this morning and brought us up to date on the COVID-19 procedures.

Texas has 875 new cases yesterday, Bell county has 153, Coryell County shows 86, Burnet is up to 14 cases, and Lampasas still has the 2, which are now estimated to be recovered.

Lampasas has done 167 tests, with 44 pending, and 1 was positive, but the person lived in another county.

The kids seem to be getting in the groove doing home school, and the Lampasas School District has adapted to this as well. There is new information on their websites daily.

She stresses to *continue social distancing*, wear masks in public, wash your hands A LOT, use sanitizer, and if you're sick, STAY HOME!

With the guidance in place to reopen the economy, Dr. Hay still stresses social distancing. The research she has done puts the safe zone at about mid-June. That is when she and her family will begin to do things differently.

Her quote for today was" Do you want to learn from your mistakes, or do you want to learn from everyone else's mistakes so you don't have to do it yourself?"

Dr. Hay is quick to point out that the virus has not gone away. While there are vaccines being developed, and the tests are being fine-tuned, COVID-19 is still here, and not going anywhere A large part of the social distancing was to allow the healthcare

system a chance to prepare, and hospitals and clinics now have more knowledge and supplies to treat patients. New information is coming to light continually with the COVID-19, and one thing that they have started seeing is that the virus can attack your bodies nerves, creating a paralysis of sorts

Dr. Hay also stated again, that if you are feeling ill, call your doctor or the ER before you go. They may advise you to stay

Grants From The City of Lampasas

Lampasas Radio received the following from the City Manager: "At a Special Called meeting held April 20th, the Lampasas City Council approved two programs to assist local businesses that have been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. "Although almost all businesses have suffered during this time, these programs will target operations that were closed by State or local Executive Orders," stated Mayor Misti Talbert. The assistance comes in the form of a COVID-19 Emergency Grant Program from the Lampasas Economic Development Corporation that will provide up to \$3,000.00 to businesses on a sliding scale; and a Utility Assistance Program from the City that will cover the first month of utilities for businesses that were closed due the Order. According to the LEDC, \$100,000.00 is allocated for the Emergency Grant Program, and City staff has estimated approximately \$72,000.00 will be used for the Utility Assistance Program. Applications for both programs are available on the City of Lampasas website, www.cityoflampasas.com, and businesses are encouraged to apply as soon as possible. "We hope to assist as many businesses as possible, but we may not be able to fund all applications," stated Mandy Walsh, Economic Development Director.
