The following is editorial opinion: Are You Anti-Tobacco For Kids?

If so, you'll probably feel happy about the law being considered in both state and national legislatures that would raise the legal smoking age from 18 to 21.

The bill in the U.S. Senate is being pushed by Mitch McConnell, the Senate Majority Leader. H-m-m, wait a minute, isn't McConnell the Senator from Kentucky, where tobacco is 25% of the total agricultural crop and the 2nd greatest producer of tobacco in the country? - the state with 120 counties where, according to the University of Kentucky, 119 of them grow tobacco? That's odd!

Or is it...a little research reveals that the tobacco company lobbyists are actually pushing the over 21bill. Researching a little more we find that anti-tobacco enthusiasts say the bill will have little effect. They say the tobacco companies are more interested in keeping and creating new addictions through new flavored brands, vaping, and something they're working on called IQOS. IQOS is a new product of Philip Morris that heats tobacco and turns it into a vapor but doesn't burn it. It hasn't been approved by the FDA yet, but in Europe and 45 countries altogether, they're selling it in Apple-like stores with a huge and glamorous production.

IQOS is just one more way to inhale nicotine and create addictions, but the tobacco giant is evidently going to make it the next big thing. If cigarettes and cigars and pipes were all taken away, tobacco is evidently just going to switch to forms of vaping. The
