The High yesterday 82° The Low this morning 69°

Today: The small 30% rain chance could getcha', so don't leave your clothes on the line while you go to town...but then again, it's a 70% chance that won't happen today. Look for an 81° high, with S-SE wind at 15-20 mph that could gust to 30 mph.

Tonight: A 50% chance of rain overnight, though the thought is that it wouldn't be much, perhaps a tenth of an inch. The low temp should be about 69° by morning and the wind won't let up much, coming out of the south at 14 mph and gusting to 25..

Wednesday: The best chance of rain this week, a 70% shot at rain in the area, and maybe as much as an inch of the wet stuff. We really do need the rain. Some of those good April totals in other counties just haven't happened in Lampasas. The forecast also calls for more wind. S-SE wind 10-15 mph and gusting, combined with a 77° high, will dry us out even more if we don't get rain.

Overnight, the rain chances decrease to 50%. The low will be about 67° and the wind S-SE at 10 mph.

Rest of the week: Thursday will bring a 40% chance of rain after 1pm, partly sunny sky, and a high near 81°.

Friday will bring the rain chance back to 70% again. It will likely be cloudy and up to 77° at the high with SE wind light at 5-10 mph. Overnight the rain chances will go away fast, dropping to 30%.

The weekend ahead looks like a decent 40% chance of a shower on Saturday, clearing to sunshine in the afternoon and up to 80°. It will be partly cloudy and down to 65° for the evening.

On Sunday the long term calls for 20% chance of a shower and up to 85° with sunshine in the afternoon.

Next week starts with a 40% rain chance on Monday.

District Court Notes



Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on April 26, 2019. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 28 cases were brought to the court, 21 of them involved men and 7 were women.

On a charge of prohibited substance in a correctional facility, Donald Wade Edmondson tested positive for controlled substances, and his bond was found insufficient. Aaron Schoch, on a charge of possession of controlled substance PG1, failed to appear and a warrant was issued.

There were 9 total cases involving possession of a controlled substance, one for possession of 4-200 grams, one for 1-4 grams, and the remaining 7 for under one gram.

Felony cases for burglary, theft or robbery totaled 2 for theft of property \$2500-\$30,000. There was one case for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon, one for theft of a firearm, and one for evading arrest. There is also one arson charge on the docket.

There was one case for fraud use or false possession of identifying information, and one for forgery of a financial instrument of an elderly person. A bond surrender was granted for Lucas Ritter on this charge, and a warrant was issued.

Electronic charges include one charge of unlawful interference use or discovery of wire or oral electronic communication, and one for unlawful disclosure or promotion of intimate visual media.

Crimes causing personal harm showed 5 assault cases, including; aggravated assault against a family/ household member with a weapon, assault causing bodily injury to a family member, continuous violence against the family, assault against family/ household member, impeding breathing/circulation, and assault against a family/household member with previous convictions.

Of the 28 cases presented to the court 11 were settled. Kelly Bender of Lampasas was sentenced to 4 years deferred adjudicated probation with a \$750 fine plus costs and fees for possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. . On a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram in a drug free zone, Vanessa Sanchez of Kempner was sentenced to 3 years TDCJ with credit for time served. Ernesto Delapena of Lampasas, on a charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, was punished with 5 years deferred adjudication probation along with a \$2000 fine plus costs and fees.

Lee Anthony Garcia, of Lampasas, was sentenced on each of his 3 cases to 5 years adjudicated probation plus costs and fees. The three charges against Garcia are assault on a family/household member/impeding breathing or circulation, theft of a firearm, and possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram in a drug free zone. The sentences will run concurrently.

Justine Dewald of Kempner saw her probation amended to include treatment on the charges of theft \$2500-\$30,000 and abandoning or

Funeral/Death Notice

Thomas Edward Walker, 65 of Lampasas, Texas entered into peace April 13, 2019 at Baylor Scott and White Hospital in Temple.

He was born August 5, 1953 in Austin, Texas to Lewis Conrad and Mary Ruth McCulley Walker. That same year, the family moved south to Monte Alto in the Rio Grande Valley where Lewis began employment with the Texas Soil Conservation Service. That job took the family to various places across south Texas and north to Seymour. In 1959, Lewis and Mary Ruth brought their sons David and Thomas back to the home place on FM 1690, where Lewis farmed and raised sheep and goats and the boys attended Lampasas schools.

In 1972, Thomas began a lifetime commitment to service in the military, joining the US Army where he served as an Indirect Fire Infantryman, a unit Supply Specialist, Inventory Clerk and later vehicle mechanic. He rose in rank to become a non-commissioned officer. Thomas was ordered back to active duty with the Army National Guard and served in Operation Iraqi Freedom, deploying to both Iraq and Kuwait. He was awarded the Iraq Campaign Medal. He also served in Headquarters, Headquarters Company, 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley, KS; Hanau Germany, Dallas, Fort Bliss, Brownwood and was discharged at Fort Hood after 20 years of service.

He is survived by his brother, David C. Walker and wife LaDell of Lampasas; cousin, Jane Williamson of Woodway and many treasured friends he has made.

Visitation is Thursday May 2nd from 5-7pm at Sneed Funeral Chapel. A burial service will be held in the family cemetery on his home place Friday, May 3rd at 1pm with full military honors.
