Look Twice for Motorcycles

May is National Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month

From TxDOT: As motorcycle fatalities continue to rise and the spring weather draws more riders to Texas roadways, TxDOT is urging drivers to look twice and be considerate on the road around motorcycle riders. In 2022, 562 motorcycle riders were killed in motor vehicle crashes, an 8% increase over the previous year.



“People on motorcycles are more vulnerable on our roadways,” said TxDOT Executive Director Marc Williams. “It’s important for drivers to pay extra attention and look out for motorcycles — especially at intersections, when turning in front of oncoming traffic and while changing lanes. We all want to get home safe.”

In addition to National Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, TxDOT’s annual safety campaign “Share the Road: Look Twice for Motorcycles” also aims to protect motorcyclists by educating drivers on how to safely share the road.

Here are some safety precautions all motorists should keep in mind to help prevent motorcycle crashes: (1) Stay alert. Give driving your full attention (2) Pay special attention at intersections. One-third of all motorcycle fatalities happen at roadway intersections (3) Take extra care when making a left turn (4) Look twice when changing lanes. Check mirrors, check blind spots, and always use turn signals (5) Give motorcyclists room when passing them. Move over to the passing lane and don’t crowd the motorcyclist’s full lane. (6) Stay back. If you’re behind a motorcycle, always maintain a safe following distance. When a motorcyclist downshifts, it can catch drivers off guard since there are no brake lights to signal reduced speed.

State Sales Tax Revenue Totaled \$4.1 Billion in April

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar yesterday said state sales tax revenue totaled \$4.09 billion in April, 6.7 percent more than in April 2022. The majority of April sales tax revenue is based on sales made in March and remitted to the agency in April.

"April sales tax revenue growth, moderately in excess of general price inflation, suggests economic expansion continues in spite of higher interest rates and fears of a recession," Hegar said. "The strongest growth continues to be from sectors primarily driven by business spending".

Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in April 2023 was up 8.8 percent compared with the same period a year ago. Sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 56% of all tax collections.

"Click to Cancel"

The Federal Trade Commission today proposed a "click to cancel" provision requiring sellers to make it as easy for consumers to cancel their enrollment as it was to sign up. That is just one of several significant updates the Commission is proposing to its rules regarding subscriptions and recurring payments. The new click to cancel provision, along with other proposals, would go a long way to rescuing consumers from seemingly never-ending struggles to cancel unwanted subscription payment plans for everything from cosmetics to newspapers to gym memberships.

"Some businesses too often trick consumers into paying for subscriptions they no longer want or didn't sign up for in the first place," said FTC Chair Lina M. Khan. "The proposed rule would require that companies make it as easy to cancel a subscription as it is to sign up for one. The proposal would save consumers time and money, and businesses that continued to use subscription tricks and traps would be subject to stiff penalties."

The proposal would make several specific changes, including implementing a simple cancellation mechanism; to address this issue, the proposed rule would require businesses to make it at least as easy to cancel a subscription as it was to start it. The proposal

would also require sellers to first ask consumers if they want to hear additional offers. In other words, a seller must take "no" for an answer and upon hearing "no" must immediately implement the cancellation process.
