Today: Look for cloudy skies with a high near 85°. Wind will be S today near 10 mph. There is a 60% chance of precipitation today.

In 1988, the law was amended by Ronald Reagan to make the first Thursday in May the National Day of Prayer each year.

I like to remember my Grandad and his wagon. He never had a pickup truck, just two bay horses and a wagon to haul things around on. I loved riding beside him.

I like to remember when life took me in the 70's to Berlin, Germany. The "iron curtain" was still up. The "wall" and barbed wire and guard houses kept the East Germans captive in the poor and bleak East Berlin. I went across the border for a while on a tour bus with a female East German soldier telling us how wonderful life was under communism. It sure didn't look good to me.

I like to remember the years I spent teaching and the young faces of students whose minds I hoped I would affect and help develop, and I like to remember all the friends I made being the local "radio man" in town.

Our memories, our experiences, our adventures, are what define us. Here's hoping that you, whether young or old, will take close note of your adventures. You'll savor them one day. Here's rootin' for ya'. **RW**

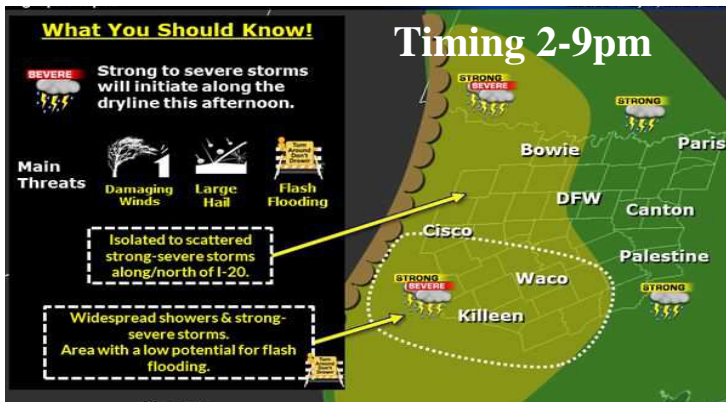
