The Weather



The High yesterday 94° The Low this morning 73°

The forecasters say that rain chances today in Central Texas are decreasing. Following the cold front, skies should clear from north to south. North winds will bring in cooler and drier air. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's, after yesterday's high 90's. This should be a nice cool-down. Lows tonight should be in the mid 50's.

Today: Mostly cloudy with a high temperature near 76°. Winds will be N-NE at 10-20 mph and gusting to 25. There is a 40% chance of showers and storms before 1pm.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with gradual clearing and a low around 53°. The wind will be N at 5-10 mph.

Wednesday: Sunny with a high near 83° in the afternoon. North around at 5-10 mph will shift to the east in the afternoon.

Wednesday Night: Clear, with a low around 58° and a light S-SE wind.

Thursday: Sunny with a high near 87° and S wind at 5-10 mph increasing in the afternoon. Gusts could be 25 mph.

Thursday Night: Mostly cloudy and about 68 for the low. S wind at 15-20 mph decreasing to 10-15 mph. Wind gusts could reach 25 mph.

Deadline Approaching in Texas for SBA Loans Due to Drought

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Director Tanya N. Garfield of the U.S. Small Business Administration's Disaster Field Operations Center -West today reminded small nonfarm businesses in 43 Texas counties and neighboring counties in Oklahoma of the June 4, 2020, deadline to apply for an SBA federal disaster loan for economic injury. These low-interest loans are to offset economic losses because of reduced revenues caused by drought in the following primary counties that began Sept. 10, 2019.

Primary Texas counties: Baylor, Bell, Callahan, Foard, Hardeman, Haskell, Jones, Knox, Milam, Nolan, Runnels, Shackelford, Taylor, Throckmorton and Williamson;

Neighboring Texas counties: Archer, Bastrop, Brown, Burleson, Burnet, Childress, Coke, Coleman, Concho, Coryell, Cottle, Eastland, Falls, Fisher, King, Lampasas, Lee, McLennan, Mitchell, Robertson, Scurry, Stephens, Stonewall, Tom Green, Travis, Wichita, Wilbarger and Young;

According to Garfield, small nonfarm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations of any size may apply for Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. "Economic Injury Disaster Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact," said Garfield.

"SBA eligibility covers both the economic impacts on businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers that have suffered agricultural production losses caused by the disaster and businesses directly impacted by the disaster. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the applicant suffered any property damage," Garfield added.

The interest rate is 4 percent for businesses and 2.75 percent for private nonprofit organizations with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

By law, SBA makes Economic Injury Disaster Loans available when the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture designates an agricultural disaster. The Secretary declared this disaster on Oct. 4, 2019. Businesses primarily engaged in farming or ranching are not eligible for SBA disaster assistance. Agricultural enterprises should contact the Farm Services Agency about the U.S. Department of Agriculture assistance made available by the Secretary's declaration. However, nurseries are eligible for SBA disaster assistance in drought disasters.

Applicants may apply online, receive additional disaster assistance information and download applications at <https://disasterloanassistance.sba.gov/>.
