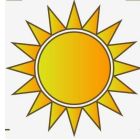

The Weather

The high yesterday 77° This morning's low 52°



Today: Sunny, with a high temperature near 83°. Winds will become light from the E-NE, courtesy of a cool front that won't do much but change the wind direction.

Tonight: Clear skies with a low temperature near 58°. Wind will become calm overnight.

Friday: Sunny with a high temperature near 84°. Winds will be S at 10-15 mph gusting to 20mph.

National Day of Prayer

Today, May 6th 2021 is the Annual National Day of Prayer.



The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people of all faiths to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed

into law by President Harry S. Truman.

The National Day of Prayer belongs to all Americans. It is a day that transcends differences, bringing together people from all backgrounds. A timeline goes like this;

1775 – The first Continental Congress called for a National Day of Prayer: 1863 – Abraham Lincoln called for such a day: 1952 – Congress established NDP as an annual event by a joint resolution, signed into law by President Truman (82-324):

1988 – The law was amended and signed by President Reagan, designating the National Day of Prayer as the first Thursday in May.

Here are some interesting facts according to the website nationaldayofprayer.org

There have been 146 national calls to prayer, humiliation, fasting and thanksgiving by the President of the United States (1789 – 2017).

There have been 69 Presidential Proclamations for a National Day of Prayer (1952 – 2017). Gerald R. Ford (1976), George H. Bush (1989 – 91), Barack H. Obama (2012), and Donald J. Trump (2017) are the only U.S. Presidents to sign multiple National Day of Prayer Proclamations in the same year.

Every President since 1952 has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

35 of the 45 U.S. Presidents have signed proclamations for National Prayer. Three of the Presidents who did not sign a proclamation died while serving in office. Two Presidents, not included in the count—William Howard Taft and Warren Gamaliel Harding, signed proclamations for Thanksgiving and Prayer.

Locally, according to Pastor Rick at 1st Baptist Church Lampasas, area churches are each individually having their own arrangements. Pastor Rick advises to check the websites of the local churches for specifics.

A Visit with the Lampasas City Manager

Lampasas City Manager Finley de Graffenried was in the Lampasas Radio studios Wednesday morning for his weekly visit with Ronnie Witcher.

Mr. de Graffenried began the conversation with discussing the mural on the Calvert building being discussed Monday at the City Council meeting. Another discussion will be on livestock in the city limits, continued at Council's request. Mr. Witcher brought up that the Garden Club lost their tools to thieves last week. If anyone sees or has seen something suspicious or some extra tools, please let someone know.

The election was brought up. There were 2 contested races, and TJ Monroe and Zac Morris were elected as Mayor and City Council place 1. Herb Pearce and Randy Clark ran unopposed for places 6 and 2. Mr. de Graffenried felt it was a reasonable turnout.

The ground crews are watching the grass grow and trying to knock it down as fast as they can, according to the City Manager. The city facilities are being readied for summer, the pools and the 580 sports complex, as well as others. The pool staffing has gotten better, according to Mr. de Graffenried, with almost a full crew. They may run 1 day short at each pool, but the city is trying to find a schedule where there is never a day without a pool.

The city is looking into software that will help the city crews with weather related incidents. While the crews are out working, there are programs that can specify problems, such as the water tank being low or showing the crews where specific outages are with city utilities. Mr. de Graffenried wants the city to be able to be more proactive in switching and isolating lines, switching loads, and possible installing equipment inline to make the switching more efficient. The goal is to save the city money and time. However, like he said, when you go through a deep freeze like we experiences, you see the value in some of these ideas.
