Lampasas City Council to Meet

The Lampasas City Council will meet this afternoon for regular sessions. The Workshop session will begin at 5:30pm and the agenda includes: the draft agenda for the May 19, 2022 Council Work Session, the 2nd quarter financial update, discussion regarding Calvert municipal Building Improvement Project Scope, discussion and presentation of fiscal year 2022 Street Improvement projects, discussion of walking trails combination and options, zoning amendments related to building height, and discussion of the Fire Dept. Incident Reporting and Billing. **The regular City Council Session**, which begins at 6pm, will have a proclamation of May 15-21 as “National Police Week” and “National Public Works Week”. The Agenda also includes discussion and possible action regarding the March 2022 Investment report, the City Manager’s Report, discussion and possible action to replace the Rheem 4 ton unit at city hall, a presentation of the fiscal year 2022 Street Improvement Projects, and Fire Dept. Incident Reporting and Billing. The Council will then go into Executive Session for- relating to the authority of public power utility governing bodies to deliberate regarding competitive matters-Utilities. Council will then move back into Regular Session for discussion and possible action concerning items posted and discussed by Council in Executive Session.

Propositions Pass

(**Texas Tribune**) Texas’ high property taxes have once again taken center stage amid the state’s real estate market explosion. Home values in the state’s major metropolitan areas have surged by double digits, prompting homeowners to fret that they will see a similar rise in their property tax bills — though those don’t necessarily go hand in hand.

Proposition 1, a measure to essentially cut school district property taxes for homeowners who are 65 and older or disabled, passed by a wide margin on Saturday, according to Decision Desk. 86.88% of residents voted for proposition 1.

The vast majority of voters, 84.76%, also approved Proposition 2, to raise the state’s homestead exemption — the dollar amount of a home’s value that’s exempt from taxation by school districts — from \$25,000 to \$40,000. The owner of an average Texas home, worth about \$300,000, will save around \$175 on their annual property tax bill, Republican state Sen. Paul Bettencourt of Houston, who authored the proposals, has said.

“It’s great to see the voters of Texas vote overwhelmingly for property tax relief,” Bettencourt said Saturday. “They’re recognizing the obvious, that Texas homesteads need it.”

Badger Baseball finished with an exciting and sometimes glorious series Saturday night in Stephenville.

It was the UIL bi-district matchup where the 4th place district finisher, in this case Lampasas, has to play the 1st place district finisher, in this case the Iowa Park Hawks.

The 4th place teams nearly always get crushed, and it was feared that it would be the case again this time, since the Hawks had come into the game with very few losses from a strong district and the Badgers were in a rebuilding year with a team loaded with freshmen.

The playoff was to be a 2 of 3 series with the first game Friday evening in distant Weatherford. That Friday night game saw the matchup on the mound of Badger freshmen pitcher Jonas Anderson vs Hawk Junior Ty Cunningham. The Badgers finished the game with 5 hits, the Hawks had 12 and the game ended with a resulting score of 8-4.

In that first game loss junior Tak Stinnett had 2 RBIs, sophomore Aden Rascoe and sophomore Rawlin Smith had the other 2. Game two was set for 4pm in Stephenville, but there was a preceding playoff series that ran longer and put the Badger-Hawk game start back an hour or so. Game two saw Badger ace pitcher Tak Stinnett on the mound, versus the Hawks number 2, Korvin Lalumia. Lalumia is a curious "submarine" pitcher whose sidearm throw rises up from about 18 inches to strike zone. A team not used to such a pitcher could be victimized, but the Badgers hit the ball surprisingly well throughout the game. Unfortunately the powerful Hawks defense trumped most of them. Stinnett only gave up 4 hits in his 80 pitch stand on the mound, throwing 68% strikes and giving up just 1 run.

The Badgers were ahead 1-0 after a J.T. Posten double in the 3rd and Dax Brookerson singled, bringing him home.

The Badger lead went away in the bottom of the 6th when Iowa Park's Barnard got a double, then scored moments later.

It went to the 7th inning and Lampasas' freshman catcher Elijah Calderon tripled. His courtesy runner scored moments later on a J.T. Posten single to left field.

The Badger defense held out in the bottom of the 7th, thanks to 3 fly ball catches in a row by Carson Bekker in right field. The Badgers had beat the mighty Iowa Park team 2-1.

Game three started shortly afterward and the Badger bats went wild, racking up five runs on hits by Dax Brookerson, Aden Rascoe, Rawlin Smith, Avery Smith, and Elijah Calderon, and on some steals. The lead carried to the third inning when the Hawks came back with four runs. The Badgers had Nate Borchardt on the mound and Hawk bats were strong as they battled to come back. In the 4th inning they found their groove and began to score. Coach Evans changed pitchers to Ryu Maldonado and the Hawks continued the scoring, finishing the inning ahead 9-5. Tak Stinnett was brought back to the mound in the 5th inning but the Hawks got two more runs making it 11-5.

The Hawks got one more run in the top of the 6th. We saw freshman J.T. Posten brought to the pitcher's mound, a position we hadn't seen him in during the district season. It's worth mentioning again that Posten and other freshmen and sophomores have been valuable assets to the Badger team this year and should make the team great contenders in the next few years.

The Badgers began to rally in the bottom of the 6th, picking up three runs on hits by Nate Borchardt, J.T. Posten, a double by Tak Stinnett and a single by Dax Brookerson, That made it 12-8 in favor of the Hawks and the game would finish with that score. Iowa Park deservedly goes on to be the Bi-district Champion and is headed to Area competition.

In our district, the Stephenville Yellowjackets are the only team to make it out on top and head to Area.
