## **Meetings Today**





## Child Tax Credit Checks on the Way

According to an article in CNET, the IRS will begin sending out payments this summer to some low- and moderate-income families, depending on the age of their children. Starting in July, families will get monthly payments of \$250 to \$300. The



payouts will continue through December. The money is part of an increase to the 2021 child tax credit from the American Rescue Plan that passed in March. Previously, the amount was \$2,000 but has been increased to \$3,000. Families with children under the age of 6 will get \$3,600. (The change also allows 17-year-olds to qualify for the first time.)

Unlike stimulus checks, the expanded child tax credit will be paid out in two distinct phases. Half your child tax credit total will arrive in monthly checks, beginning in July and continuing through December. The other half will be paid out on your 2021 tax return when you file in 2022. Anyone who qualifies and files a 2020 return by the new May 17 tax deadline will begin receiving monthly checks automatically -- no need to file, claim, request or otherwise hunt down your money, as long as the IRS knows how many dependents you have.
