The Weather

Adamsville Receives LCRA Grant

An \$11,351 grant from the Lower Colorado River Authority and Hamilton County Electric Cooperative will allow the Adamsville Community Center to install additional restrooms and outdoor covered areas.

The Community Development Partnership Program grant, along with \$2,838 in matching funds, also will enable the center to add barbecue pits and additional seating in new covered areas outdoors.

The center, built in the 1940s as a venue for community activities, has been the site of parties, wedding showers, family reunions and memorials through the years. A one-room house on the property will house the new restroom facilities.

"The gentleman who donated the property to the community center lived in the one-room house," said Sharon Watson, treasurer for the Adamsville Community Center. "It's been vacant since he passed away. The house already has the foundation for us to build on, so it will be easy to convert it into a restroom area." The center is popular with both residents and people from surrounding communities. It is the only donation-based public meeting hall available in the area "We host an annual barbecue that brings in people from several of the communities nearby," Watson said. "Some years, there have been more than 100 people in attendance. Having new restroom facilities will cut down on wait times."

Watson said the grant also will make it possible for the center to host larger events in the future. The community grant is one of 25 grants awarded recently through LCRA's Community Development Partnership Program, which helps volunteer fire departments, local governments, emergency responders and nonprofit organizations fund capital improvement projects in

LCRA's wholesale electric, water and transmission service areas. The program is part of LCRA's effort to give back to the communities it serves. Hamilton County Electric Cooperative is one of LCRA's wholesale electric customers and is a partner in the grant program.

LCRA and Hamilton County Electric Cooperative representatives present an \$11,351 grant for updates to the Adamsville Community Center. (below picture)

The Blotter

Of Copperas Cove, Texas was arrested in the 300 block of E. 4th St. on a Lampasas Police Dept. warrant for sexual assault of a child. There was a reported fraud in the 400 block of S. Live Oak St. at 11:00am. The afternoon saw a reported disturbance in the 600 block of S. Main St. at 3:43pm, a criminal mischief in the 1300 block of CTE at 6:31pm, then a reported harassment was called in from the 7000 block of 190E at 7:30pm. There was one more arrest as Billy Joe Kirkham II, 32, of Lampasas, Texas was arrested in the 900 block of N. Elm St. on 2 Lampasas County warrants at 7:40pm

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows in Kempner officer dealt with animal/livestock issues, an alarm call, a mental health call, a reported disturbance, and civil matters. Out in the County there were medical calls, reports of suspicious activity, reported disturbances and a requested welfare check. Deputies went into Cove on a medical call.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of 50year old Renee Burden for failure to ID a fugitive/intent to give false information, and 28 year old Nick Hernandez for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on May 7th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 44 cases were brought to the court with 30 cases involving men, and 14 case involving a woman. Annelisa Hennigan failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1/1-4 grams. There were 21 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 9 cases for less than a gram, 2 cases for 1-4 grams, and 6 cases for 4-200 grams. There was one case involving possession of a controlled substance/ PG2, for under a gram. There were 4 DWI cases, 3 for a single defendant. There was 1 case each for; prohibited substance in a correctional facility, forgery . harassment of a public servant, and unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. There were 2 cases each for burglary, credit/debit card abuse, and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. There were also 4 cases of engaging in organized criminal activity.

Cases involving personal harm included one case for intoxication assault, and one for sexual assault of a child. There were 3 cases each for assault on a family member, and indecency w/a child/sexual contact.

Of the 44 cases, 5 were settled. Terraina Terry of Bastrop pled guilty to assault on a family/household member w/previous convictions, and was sentenced to 4 years probation plus fines and costs. Jimmy Lee Wesson of San Angelo was sentenced on 4 charges. He saw one of his engaging in organized criminal activity charges receive an order barring prosecution, and was sentenced to 10 years probation w/ SAFPF plus court costs on the other organized criminal activity charge. On the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1 less than a gram, he was sentenced to 5 years probation with court costs, and for possession of a controlled substance PG1/4-200 grams, he was sentenced to continue on probation and complete aftercare for SAFPF, plus court costs.

All other cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

Click-it-or-Ticket is Back

— Despite a drop in the number of traffic crashes throughout the year, 2020 saw a spike in the number of fatalities overall and deaths of people in Texas from not wearing a seat belt. That's why TxDOT is reminding everyone that buckling up is the best defense in a crash. Unfortunately, in 2020 there was a 16% increase in deaths of unbuckled motorists. There were 1,073 fatalities in 2020 and 926 fatalities in 2019 due to people not wearing seat belts. Putting on a seat belt only takes a few seconds and doing so reduces the risk of dying by up to 45% for people in the front seat of passenger cars and up to 60% for people in pickup trucks. Research shows pickup truck drivers and passengers continue to lag in seat belt use. Last year, 59% of all crashes in which unbuckled drivers or passengers died occurred at night.

From May 24 to June 6, as the summer driving season starts and families head out to celebrate Memorial Day, Texas officers and deputies will step up enforcement of the state's seat belt and child car seat laws. Texas law requires everyone in a vehicle to be properly secured in the front or back seat or face fines and fees up to \$200. Children younger than 8 years old must be restrained in a child safety seat or booster seat unless they are taller than 4 feet 9 inches. If a child isn't secured, the driver faces fines of up to \$250. From 2002 to 2019, the Click It or Ticket initiative in Texas is estimated to have saved more than 6,000 lives, prevented more than 100,000 serious injuries, and resulted in \$23.6 billion in economic savings, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Remember, Click-it-or-Ticket!
