# The Weather

## Lampasas City Council

Fire Chief Jeff Smith opened the Council Workshop in the May, 10<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting by sharing that the area continue to show a decline of active COVID cases, and Lampasas now has six active cases. There are a total of 2935 fully vaccinated people in the 76550 ZIP code, which is almost 50% of the residents. Once again, a push for a mural on the vacant concrete wall on the Calvert Building was brought forth by Vision Lampasas. Council declined that idea for something more relevant to the building. Police Chief Sammy Bailey offered her department's recommendations and amendments to the current livestock and fowl regulations for the City. She stressed that this is a fluid, changing document until it is brought forth for formal approval. *The Radiogram encourages our readers to look over this document as it likely affects you*! Chief Bailey hopes to have a final draft by next council meeting May 24<sup>th</sup>.

A hike and bike concept plan was presented for the 580 Sports Complex, and cost seems to be a factor for the City Council. Two items were discussed in the closed Executive Session. Both involved discussions with attorneys about 1) possible breach of contract and 2) the Court of Appeals in the case of Central Texas Water Supply v. Kempner Water Supply Corp. and City of Lampasas. The discussion and action on these two items were unanimously approved.

The impending renovation of the Hostess House was discussed, as well as City Manager Finely deGraffenried acknowledging the departure of our County Health Authority, Dr. Hay. The last action item council completed and approved was the amended bylaws to the Lampasas Economic Development Corporation which asked that the City Manager have the latitude to appoint an Executive Director. The election results of the May 1, 2021 election are as follows. T.J Monroe is elected mayor, Zac Morris is elected Councilperson for Place One, Randy Clark is elected Councilperson for Place Two, and Herb Pearce is elected Councilperson for Place Six. Congratulations to these newly elected public servants!

# **Mobile Vaccination Units**

Dr. Hay, the Lampasas County Health Authority asked us to share the following: On may 6<sup>th</sup>, Governor Greg Abbott, the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM), and the Texas Military Department (TMD) announced the launch of the State Mobile Vaccination Team Call Center. Beginning May 7th at 8am, Texas businesses or civic organizations have been able to call 844-90-TEXAS and select Option 3 to schedule a visit from a state mobile vaccine team to vaccinate employees, visitors, or members. To qualify for a visit, a business or civic organization must have 10 or more employees, visitors, or members who voluntarily choose to be vaccinated. Dr. Hav encourages homebound Texans to call the hotline and select Option 1 to request a state mobile vaccination team to visit their home. "Vaccines are the most effective tool in Texas' fight against COVID-19, and we are committed to making COVID-19 vaccines even more widely available to Texans across the state," said Governor Abbott. "The State Vaccine Call Center will help connect businesses and civic organizations with these life-saving shots and ensure that more Texans have an opportunity to get vaccinated. I urge organizations and businesses to call 844-90-TEXAS and schedule a visit from a state mobile vaccine team. Here in Texas, COVID-19 vaccines will always be strongly encouraged and always voluntary."

# **Railroad Track Repairs**


The Railroad Crossing on Fm 1715 will is scheduled to be closed for repairs on Friday May 14<sup>th</sup> from 7am-5pm. Traffic will be detoured to FM 580, to FM 2213 to US 190 and then back to FM 1715. TxDOT shared with Lampasas Radio yesterday that the rain should not affect the BNSF schedule. Message boards have been placed on each end of FM 1715 to prepare motorists for the upcoming closure.

FM 2942 (Elm Street) is scheduled for work on May  $17^{th}$ , CR 2640 on May  $18^{th}$ , and CR 2636 on may  $19^{th}$ .
