The Weather



The High yesterday 94° The Low this morning 64°.

Today: Sunny skies with a high temperature near 97°. Wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly clear skies becoming mostly cloudy with a 20% chance of precipitation. The low will be near 69°. Winds will be from the S-SE at 5-15 mph shifting W overnight.

Saturday: The sky will be mostly sunny, and the high temperature will be near 96°. Wind will be S-SE near 5-10 mph.

Mills County Incident

The Mills County Sheriff's Dept. said that around 2am Thursday morning a Mills County Deputy, Zach Sandlin attempted a traffic stop on a car traveling south on Highway 183. The vehicle did not stop and the passenger was seen "brandishing a pistol out the window" during the pursuit. The passenger began shooting multiple rounds towards Deputy Sandlin's patrol car. (The Sheriff's Dept. states that neither Deputy Sandlin nor his car was struck.)

While the deputy was waiting for backup, both occupants of the car fled on foot. The vehicle was secured and a coordinated effort was started to locate the fugitives.

DPS sent an airplane with an infrared unit that was called "invaluable" and 31 year old Aaryan Amburgey was located as he hid in the thick brush. He was arrested without incident. The other person in the car was 29 year old Penny Sims, who was also found and taken into custody without incident. Penny Sims is charged with evading arrest/detention and Aaryan Amburgey is charged with unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon and assault against a public servant. Other charges are pending according to the Mills County Sheriff's Dept.

The assisting agencies included were Texas Highway Patrol, Lampasas County Sheriff's Office, Texas Game Wardens, Texas Rangers, Texas DPS Aviation, Texas Dept. of Criminal Justice tracking dogs, Texas DPS Search and Rescue Team and almost all of the Mills County Sheriff's Dept. deputies.

Democratic Lieutenant Governor Runoff Election

(Texas Tribune) With the nominees for governor already decided, the top of the ballot for this month's Democratic primary runoff election will be a choice between Mike Collier and state Rep. Michelle Beckley of Carrollton for lieutenant governor.

The winner of the May 24 race will then mount an uphill challenge in the November midterms against Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick, who already won the Republican primary in March. Patrick is well-funded, and a Democrat hasn't won a statewide office in Texas since 1994. Early voting runs from May 16-20.

Collier and Beckley bested Carla Brailey, the former vice chair of the Texas Democratic Party, in the March 1 primary, finishing as the first- and second-place candidates, respectively. Collier finished with about 41% of the vote, while Beckley received about 30%. Only about 18% of registered voters cast a ballot in the March primary this year. (cont'd on back)

(cont'd from front) What does the lieutenant governor do?

The lieutenant governor oversees the state's 31-member Senate, making it the most powerful elected position in the Texas Legislature. The officeholder can dictate much of the state's policy by influencing which bills move forward and which ones are halted.

The lieutenant governorship can also help launch officeholders into higher office. Rick Perry, one of the most well-known Texas politicians in modern history, held the office before becoming governor of Texas, launching a presidential campaign and serving as the U.S. Secretary of Energy under former President Donald Trump.

If a Democrat were to win the seat, they could champion the party's legislative priorities, which often fail to materialize in the Republican-controlled Senate, and block GOP legislation.

Wind Energy Futures Study

The U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) National Renewable Energy Laboratory yesterday released the Distributed Wind Energy Futures Study, which details the high potential to profitably deploy nearly 1,400 gigawatts (GW) of distributed wind capacity across the United States. This equates to more than half of the nation's current annual electricity consumption.

"As this study illustrates, distributed wind energy could bring clean power to millions of American households," said Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy Kelly Speakes-Backman. "By realizing this potential, we can help local communities drive their own paths to a clean energy future and support national progress toward our climate goals."

Distributed wind energy is connected to local electricity distribution networks and can provide onsite energy to businesses, farms, homes, and other users. It can help communities transition to carbon-free electricity while also reducing reliance on the nation's already constrained transmission system. Approximately 1.1 GW of distributed wind capacity is currently installed in the United States.

The study identifies states in the nation's Midwest and Heartland regions as having the largest potential for distributed wind due to the combination of high wind speeds and sufficiently high retail electricity rates. The Pacific and Northeast regions also have significant potential for expansion of "behind-the-meter" distributed wind deployments, where the distributed wind system directly offsets a specific end-user's consumption of retail electricity supply.

There are also significant opportunities to expand distributed wind in disadvantaged communities, identified as census areas with a high risk for environmental hazards and/or areas that include high proportions of low-income households. This is particularly true in the coming decade for behind-the-meter deployments in states such as Texas, Montana, Michigan, and New Mexico, potentially creating a means to reduce energy burden in these communities.
