

Sales Tax Rebate Checks

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced Wednesday he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts 1.06 billion in local sales tax allocations for May, 28.4 percent more than in May 2020. These allocations are based on sales made in March by businesses.

In our area, Evant in Hamilton County saw their rebate check increase by 12.71% over the same period last year, with a \$5763.29 rebate. Hamilton in Hamilton County saw a 35.92% increase over last year in their rebate check of \$85,576.50. In Lampasas County, all cities saw increases, with Lampasas and Lometa showing an increase of over 30%; Lometa received a rebate check for \$8199.17, a 31.57% increase over last year, Kempner received a rebate for \$12,244.54, a 20.46% increase for the same time frame, while the City of Lampasas saw a shopping 36.82% increase in sales tax rebates in March, for a total of \$245,804.96.


The Blotter
