The Weather

The High yesterday 77° The Low this morning 67° Rain at the airport yesterday .37 inches.

A flash flood watch remains in effect for Lampasas County until at least 7am Wednesday morning.

Today: Partly sunny skies and a high temperature near 85°, and a 30% chance of precipitation this afternoon. Winds will be S-SE at 5-15 mph, gusting to 20 mph. Some storms may be severe.

Tonight: Look for cloudy skies and a 40% chance of showers and storms, with a low temperature near 67°. Winds will be E-SE near 10-15 mph with possible gusts as high as 25 mph.

Tuesday: There is a 100% chance of precipitation with showers and storms, with cloudy skies. The high temperature will be near 80°, and the wind will be S-SE at 10-15 mph gusting to 30 mph. The NWS shares that flash flooding will be likely in our area.

Tuesday Night: Cloudy skies with a low temperature near 99°, and a 60% chance of showers and storms. Winds will continue S-SE at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Wednesday: A 70% chance of precipitation with mostly cloudy skies and a high near 78°. Winds will continue S-SE at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

The Week: Thunderstorm chances will continue through the weekend. Additional rounds of heavy rainfall may cause further flooding issues and significant rises on area rivers. Totals of at least 1-4 inches are expected through Sunday night with some areas receiving 5-7 inches. Amounts of 8-10 inches will be possible with strong storms, or the training effect.

Adopted Guidelines for Outdoor Burning 2021

The Lampasas County Commissioners' Court last Monday Adopted Guidelines for outdoor burning, The rules, available at the county website include notifying the Sheriff's Office before burning, burning cannot take place after dark, a responsible person has to stay with the fire, and you should have some means of control directly proportionate to the burn. The wind cannot be 23 mph or greater, and burning must be conducted at least 300 feet from any structure containing sensitive receptors, and not burning on Red Flag Days. Below is a full list of guidelines.

LAMPASAS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

ADOPTED GUIDELINES FOR OUTDOOR BURNING

Ref Outdoor Burning Rule, Title 30, Texas Administrative Code Section 111.201-221

- 1. Notify Lampasas County Sheriff's Office before starting any outdoor burns, 512-556-8255.
- 2. Burning shall not be conducted after dark. Burning shall be completed on the same day no later than one hour before sunset.
- 3. Make sure that a responsible person stays with the burn at all times while the burn is active.
- 4. Have some means to control the burn (water, shovel, equipment). Means of control should be directly related to the size of the burn being conducted.
- 5. Clear at least a six-foot distance around the burn area by mowing or grading.
- 6. Burning shall not be commenced if surface wind speed is predicted to be greater than 23 MPH during the burn period.
- 7. Burn brush, trimmings, untreated wood or paper products only. The fire should not produce black smoke. Electrical insulation, treated lumber, plastics, non-wood construction/demolition materials, heavy oils, asphalt materials, potentially explosive materials, chemical wastes, and items containing natural or synthetic rubber (i.e. tires) must not be burned.
- 8. Burning must be conducted downwind of or at least 300 feet from any structure containing *sensitive receptors located on adjacent properties unless prior written approval is obtained from the adjacent occupant.
- 9. The authority to conduct outdoor burning under this guideline does not exempt or excuse any person responsible from the consequences, damages or injuries resulting from the burning and does not exempt or excuse anyone from complying with all other applicable laws or ordinances, regulations, and orders or governmental entities having jurisdiction, even though the burning is otherwise conducted in compliance with these guidelines. Law enforcement officers may issue warnings and citations for outdoor burning violations.
- 10. No burning shall be conducted on Red Flag Warning days.
