The Weather



The High yesterday 96° The Low this morning 70°

The forecasters say look for a hot, humid, soupy day today. Most locations will exceed the 90° mark. The conditions responsible for the heat yesterday will create a wet spring like pattern beginning as early as tonight.

Today: Sunny with a high near 94° this afternoon. Winds will be S-SE at around 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Increasing clouds with a low near 69° and a SE wind at 5-10 mph shifting SW late in the night.

Thursday: Cloudy with gradual clearing and a high near 91°. The wind will be S at 5-10 mph. There is a 20% chance of showers and storms.

Thursday Night: Mostly cloudy and a low around 71° in the overnight. The SE wind should be 5-10 mph.

Friday: Showers are a possibility with a 20% chance of precipitation. Otherwise it will be partly sunny and up to 89° with a S wind at 5-10 mph.

Friday Night: A 20% chance of showers and storms. Mostly cloudy and a low temperature near 71°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

City Manager's Visit

Lampasas City Manager Finley deGraffenried was in our radio studio this morning for his weekly information session. Lampasas Radio's Ronnie Witcher questioned him about a recent City Council meeting where his periodic review was to be done by the Council.

The performance review is always carried out in a closed executive session and it was listed as such in the agenda. After the session, it was announced that no action had been taken and the Council took no vote of any kind when they came back into open session.

The City Manager later revealed that he had been granted a \$10,000 per year pay raise, bringing his annual salary up to \$140,000. Witcher's questions on the issue did not center on whether the pay raise was justified or not – deGraffenried's service to the City is generally well appreciated by the public. The questions were on whether the pay raise was timely, with the economy facing tough times ahead, and more importantly, whether the Council was proper in agreeing to raise his salary in a closed session without even a mention of the move when they went back into open session.

Mr. deGraffenried said that the pay raise was something he didn't expect to be coming out of the review, and that he expected that they would review whether the proper procedures were carried out. It was also noted that his prior \$130,000 salary had not been increased since 2015.



In other matters, deGraffenried said the Covid-19 testing had not shown any new cases in Lampasas for the last several days, still sitting at 8, and that the reopening of certain businesses hasn't created any problems so far. He also noted that, in the next meeting of the Council on Tuesday, May 26th, they would likely be taking up the issue of regulating large trucks parking in residential areas.

Major League Baseball

Revamps Season

Major League baseball plans to start their season by June 4th. They are very hopeful, but many parts will have to fall into place for this to happen. They will need the cooperation of 27 U.S. cities as well as one foreign country (Canada). The league will also need availability to more than 200,000 coronavirus tests and a promise not to interfere with the nationwide fight to contain the pandemic. This will be a daunting task for any organization as if one thing derails from the plan the whole operation will fall apart. Worst case, this will even start the spread of Covid-19 again. Beyond those challenges it gets deeper. Tests are to be administered frequently, but not every day. Those who test positive will be the only one quarantined, not the whole team. This may end up furthering the spread of Covid-19. Others say by starting the season, they will be competing against healthcare providers for tests among other personal protective equipment. Through this, the MLB will be losing approximately \$75 million. The Organizations have also agreed to playing a "half schedule" and extending the playoffs. MLB has the full support of the Trump administration behind them, calling them the "Pied Pipers" to bring the country back.

Richard Hopson Pinckney lost a courageous battle with Parkinson's disease May 17, 2020. He was born February 29, 1936 in Austin, Texas the son of Thomas Dudley and Dorothy (Crawford) Pinckney.

A 1955 graduate of Austin High, his dream was to become a State Game Warden. With the encouragement of Capt. Sprott, Richard was selected to attend the training academy for the Game & Fish Commission (now called Texas Parks & Wildlife Department) at Texas A&M University. After a first assignment on the lakes in Llano County, he was transferred to Lampasas County which had become vacant. After moving to Lampasas County, Richard met and married Sharon Casbeer, his soul mate of 57 years. Initially, he worked both Lampasas and Mills Counties. This made life interesting when he would be in one end of Lampasas County and get a call to some place near the end of Mills County. This also made life interesting for his family who at that time were expected to dispatch calls from a base station in the home at all hours of the day and night. Richard was a dedicated law enforcement officer and was recognized as Game Warden of the Years by the Parks & Wildlife Department. He also received the Shikar Safari Award as outstanding officer for Conservation officers in the Southwest Division, which was presented in St. Louis, MO. Richard was also a charter member of the Texas Game Warden Association. He retired after 35 years of service in September 1993 and for some time raised thoroughbred race horses.

Richard loved to joke with his friends and could give as much ribbing as he took, which sometimes was a lot. It goes without saying that he loved his family and adored his grandchildren. He is survived by his wife, and two sons, Richard Lane Pinckney (Martha) of Ballinger, Timothy Lamar Pinckney (DeAnna) of Mansfield, grandchildren; Hannah Hoelscher (Devon) of San Angelo, and Jase Pinckney and Reed Pinckney of Mansfield.
