The Weather

According to the forecasters, the storms overnight have set the stage for a period of unsettled weather. The elements in the atmosphere that set off the overnight storms are making the forecast and timing of future rain events difficult. Anything that moves across Central Texas tonight will probably fall apart. Storms tomorrow morning are forecasted at this time to be west of our area. The atmosphere is moist and unstable, and we have peak heating thrown in the mix. Storms that do form will also have outflow boundaries from other storms affecting their trajectory, again, making forecasts difficult. The unsettled weather is supposed to last through Monday.

Today: Mostly cloudy with a high near 88°. The wind will be S at 10-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph possible. There is a 40% chance of showers and storms from late morning to early afternoon.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low near 69° and S-SE winds at 10-15 mph. There is a 40% chance of storm overnight.

Friday: Partly sunny skies with a high temperature near 88°. Winds will be S near 5-10 mph. There is a 30% chance of showers and storms in the afternoon.

Friday Night: Partly cloudy with a low near 71°. Winds will be S-SE at 5-10 mph.

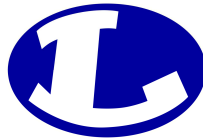
Saturday: A 30% chance of precipitation with mostly cloudy skies and a high temperature near 87°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph.

Saturday Night: 70° with mostly cloudy skies, and SE winds at 5-10 mph.

UT plans for Fall Semester



An article in the Texas Tribune states that “University of Texas at Austin students will return for fall classes, but their time on campus will be cut short as they will not be allowed to return after the Thanksgiving break, according to an email sent to students from school

officials Wednesday.

Reading days and final exams will happen remotely this fall to encourage students to stay home after Thanksgiving.

“We hope to avoid the possibility of students becoming infected during the Thanksgiving break and then spreading the virus to classmates upon their return,” read the email, which was signed by President Gregory Fenves and Jay Hartzell, interim president designate.

When the campus opens in the fall, the school will have its own coronavirus testing material. The university anticipates needing to conduct more than 500 tests a day, according to the email.

The announcement signals the beginning of concrete plans being laid out for UT students who are still wondering what the

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Wednesday shows Lometa with an accident. Kempner had calls concerning civil matters, a report of criminal mischief, animal issues, reports of suspicious activity, medical calls, a shots fired call and a reported harassment. Out in the county there was a report of suspicious activity, and animal issues. Deputies went into Cove for a reported disturbance and an accident.

Lampasas Radio received the following press release from the Lampasas County Sheriff Dept. on 5/20/20.:

"On 5/12/20 at approximately 1:32am, the Lampasas County Sheriff's Office received a telephone call from McLane Children's Hospital in Temple, Texas reporting that a three month old female child was currently in the emergency room with numerous skull fractures. The child was reported to have been residing at a residence on PR 3376F in Lampasas County. Deputies and Investigators with the LCSO responded to the residence as well as the hospital in Temple, Texas.

A subsequent investigation established probable cause to believe that the biological parents were culpable in the injuries sustained by the infant.

On 5/19/20 arrest warrants were obtained and served on Keilyla Taijeron, 20, and Lucio Cuellar for the offense of injury to a child with serious bodily injury (2nd degree felony). Arraignment of both subjects was completed and a bond of \$100,000 set for each person.

As of 5/20/20 both subjects remain in custody at the Lampasas County Jail.

The victim is expected to recover from her injuries. "

The Jail Log shows the arrest of 4 men for possession of a controlled substance PG 2 1-4 grams. The men were: Travis Carrow, 17, of Lometa; Stephen Mask, 20, of Kempner; Steven Neal, 20, of Kempner and Kenneth Pearce, 20, of Lampasas.

The Burn Ban has been lifted indefinitely.
