asked in a previous meeting to engage the services of Reliance Architecture, LLC to conduct a feasibility study in the amount of \$9,800 that included architectural services, historic preservation, MEP services, and structural services. Fraud is rampant in Texas, and infuriates legitimate shop owners and leaves some wondering if the effectiveness of inspections has been undercut by cheating.

No More Vehicle Inspections?

According to a story from NBCDFW, the Texas Senate voted Sunday night to advance a bill that would kill vehicle safety inspections. But, an amendment added to the bill would push back the end of inspections by two years, until 2025.

With a 20-11 vote the Senate opted to end inspections. The amended bill now goes back to the House for consideration. Even if Texas eliminates safety inspections, drivers in major urban areas like the large DFW counties would still need annual emissions inspections which are mandated under federal rules.
