The Weather

Lampasas City Council

Last evening's city council meeting welcomed two new faces in Council Members elect, Zac Morris for Place 1 and Herb Pearce II for Place 6. TJ Monroe, who was previously Mayor Pro Tem, was sworn in as the newly elected Mayor. Place 3 Councilman, Chuck Williamson, was voted in as the new Mayor Pro Tem. Robert Gradel retains his appointment as the Municipal Court Judge and Administer Oath of Office.

During Fire Chief Jeff Smith's COVID remarks, he says that Lampasas has a total of 3 active COVID cases, with 1 hospitalization

Police Chief Sammy Bailey delivered her proposed ordinance change to the Livestock and Fowl Ordinance for the city. She reiterated this was a draft proposal and that the final draft was not yet ready. One immediate effect of the proposed ordinance change is the declaration forbidding any roosters or swine, to include pot belly pigs. The ordinance offers residents until January of 2022 to be in compliance, or may result in fines. Once a final draft is approved, it is noted that a public hearing will be scheduled to discuss this new, potential change.

City Manager Finley deGraffenried displayed several proposed improvements to the Hostess House renovation plan. No action was taken on this item. Council approved, at the request of the County Judge, that the mayor serve on the Hill Country Transit Advisory Board. Council promptly nominated Mayor Monroe and Councilman Bob Goodart as the alternate.

Council voted unanimously granting the petition for the voluntary annexation of the Hillside Acres Subdivision, which is

approximately 37 acres of land that will consist of 27 single family homes.

The police department was granted authority to purchase a Vista-Com Recording solution to combat recurring problems in the software that records police and fire dispatching and radio traffic. The amount allotted for this purchase is not to exceed \$8665.00. Chief Bailey is optimistic that most of that cost will be refunded by the Central Texas Council of Governments.

Discussion to invest money to help in the preservation of the New Hope Baptist Church (located next to the Colored School) was postponed to July, until as Councilman Clark said, "we get a better grasp on the HOT funds" and the financial stability of these funds Council adjourned into Executive Session and emerged with no action taken.

A Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Lometa Independent School District will be held on Thursday May 27th at 7:30am in the Lometa ISD Administration Office.

The Agenda includes community input-open forum, and discussion and consideration of authorization of sale of house to be moved, delegation of spoending authority to the superintendent in exxcess of current limites for upgrades and/or refurbishment of careteria, and the superintendent report.

The Blotter

Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Monday shows a very busy 12am hour as a noise complaint was called in from the 1300 block of W. Ave. C at 12:32am; there was a reported harassment in the 1200 block of W. Ave. A at 12:45am, and a disturbance was reported in the 900 block of S. Key Ave. at 12:55 am. The afternoon shows a harassment reported in the 1300 block of CTE at 12:26pm, found property reported in the 500 block of S. Key Ave. at 4:15pm, another harassment on Snell Dr. at 6:15pm, and in the evening a suspicious person was reported in the 800 block of N. Ridge St. at 9:15pm and a disturbance was reported in the 200 block of Riverview Dr. at 10:17pm.

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa with a reported fraud, and reports of suspicious activity. In Kempner, officers dealt with medical calls, an alarm call, civil matters animal/livestock issues, reported thefts, a disturbance and a requested welfare check. Out in the county there were animal/livestock issues, civil matters, a requested welfare check, a warrant was served, and a shots fired call. Deputies went into Cove on a report of suspicious activity and a civil matter.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of 42 year old Kasey Calvery of Midland on 2 counts of Aggravated sexual assault of a child. (See District Court story for more on this). Also detained were 40 year old Shannon Mollette of Temple for possession of marijuana less than 2 oz., and 23 year old Aaron Smith of Kempner on a commitment charge.

District Court

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Special Setting May 24th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 10 cases were brought to the court with 7 cases involving men, and 3 cases involving women. These four defendants failed to appear; Bailey Carr and Antonia Felan both on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram, April Alkire for possession controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams, and Chayo Rendon on 2 charges, evading arrest and assault on a family member. Warrants have been issued.

Of the 10 cases, there were 4cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1. There were 2 cases for less than a gram, and 2 cases for 1-4 grams. There was 1 case each for assault on a family member, evading arrest, hindering a secure creditor and engaging in organized criminal activity.

There were 2 cases for burglary.

Of the 10 cases, 4 were settled. Christopher Faubiion of Lampasas pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance

PG1 1-4 grams, and received 5 years probation w/SAFPF, and on the charge of burglary of a building Mr. Faubion saw his probation extended 2 years. Dennis Narag pled guilty to engaging in organized criminal activity and was sentenced to 10 years TDCJ w/5 years probated plus court costs, a \$5000 fine and \$37,723.79 in restitution. Chasity Martin saw her charge of hindering a secured creditor reduced to a class A misdemeanor (12.44b) and was sentenced to 2 years probation, court costs, fines, and \$1900 restitution. Judge Gauntt also held a bond hearing for Kasey Calvery of Midland, who was arrested on Monday, for 2 counts of aggravated sexual assault of child. Mr. Calvery was granted 2 PR bonds at \$10,000 each.

The balance of the cases were reset.
