The Weather



The high yesterday 87° This morning's low 66°

The Rainfall at Lampasas Airport 2 in.

Fairly heavy rain and lightning came thru the area from 1am to 3am this morning.

Rainfall reports from the LCRA 's area gauges showed:
.29 in. at Burnet. 24 in. at Bend on the Colorado River
Just .1 in. at Lometa's Lake gauge

Today's forecast: The early morning thunderstorm passed thru and it becomes just cloudy and gradually clearing to become a nice sunny day with a high near 86° and south wind 10-15 mph.

Tonight: Partly cloudy, with a low about 69° and SE wind of 5-10 mph with a few gusts of 20 mph.

Thursday: It should be mostly cloudy, then clearing to a sunny day with aa high about 86°. The south wind will be 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20. Overnight it should drop to 69° with south winds of 10-15 mph.

The Rest of the Week: By Friday morning we'll see a few clouds coming in and another rain chance Friday afternoon. It should be about a 30% probability during the afternoon and rise to a 50% chance overnight. Otherwise, Friday will be a nice day, up to the mid-80s.

The weekend ahead will bring a 30% rain chance Saturday morning, then clearing, and it should be nice all day on Sunday.

Click It Or Ticket

The click it or ticket campaign continues today and runs thru June 6th. DPS troopers, local officers and deputies have stepped up enforcement of the state's seat belt and child car seat laws.

Permitless Carry Texas

Texas is doing away with gun permits, which means those who run firearm classes will take a financial hit. Handgun Texas owners no longer require a permit to carry their handgun. A Bill was cleared with a major vote in Texas House Friday.

The Bill is presently headed to the Senate. House Charge 1927 cleared with 87 in bolster and 58 against Friday taking after a marathon wrangle about Thursday.

The Bill allows "permitless carry" for all Texans who are legitimately permitted to claim a gun. Getting a permit would now be a choice. The push for what has been called constitutional carry has been a Republican priority this Texas Legislative session. Anybody who can legally buy a gun would be able to carry it. But penalties for firearm offenses would go up and police do not need a reason to stop and question those packing heat in public.

Is our economy in trouble?

What happened to hard days work to bring home the bacon? The number of unfilled jobs has reached record-high levels last year. We are not seeing enough workers going back to work after the pandemic hit of Covid-19.

There are 9.8 million people who are "unemployed" and 16.2 million people are demanding unemployment compensation. It is a strange occurrence that companies are complaining of "labor shortages" and employ fewer workers. Since the beginning of this year, job vacancies have increased by 22%, hiring has increased by 18%, and job applications have decreased by 23%.

The restaurant industry and retail-related industries are the two top industries in need of workers.

When the reports were released, there were growing concern that employers could not find enough workers to fill vacancies, which in turn could slow the economic recovery down more than expected. Labor shortages are widespread, which is driving up prices and making our economical recovery more difficult.

In Lampasas companies are recruiting for a total of 566 job. The Lampasas EDC will be hosting their Job Fair on Thursday, June 10th from 10 - 2 at the LCHEC (L-Check) building at 208 E Ave B here in Lampasas. Water-Efficient Products And ENERGY STAR Tax Holiday

The state's Water-Efficient Products and ENERGY STAR® sales tax holiday is this weekend. During the ENERGY STAR Sales Tax Holiday, certain energy-efficient products displaying the ENERGY STAR logo can be bought tax free, which include air conditioners priced at \$6,000 or less, refrigerators priced at \$2,000 or less, ceiling fans, fluorescent light bulbs, dishwashers, dehumidifiers and washing machines.

The sales tax holiday also applies to lawn and garden products that help conserve water outdoors. Qualifying items include soaker or drip-irrigation hoses; moisture controls for sprinkler or irrigation systems; mulch; plants, trees and grasses. Those items can be purchased tax free for residential use only.

Kempner city council meeting

Kemper held their city council meeting last night. The meeting started off with a prayer followed by the pledge. Next on the agenda was non-action items. Mr. Witicker and Mrs. Johnson made a recommendation that the city of Kempner get a farmer's market to try and boost people coming to Kempner and bring the community together.
