

The Weather



The High yesterday 85° The Low this morning 74°

Wind gusts of 20-25 mph continued to hammer the Lampasas area on Tuesday.

Today: A 40% chance of rain, mainly late this afternoon. Some of that could be thunderstorms with high winds. Otherwise, the high should be about 87° under cloudy skies with south winds 10-20 mph and gusting to 25.

Tonight: Rain, mainly in the evening before 1am, is a 60% likelihood. This is the front edge of a cold front and it could bring a strong thunderstorm, though it's not expected that rainfall would amount to more than a half inch at best. After midnight, the strong south wind will go away and it will turn to fairly light north wind. The low temperature may drop to as low as 68° by morning.

Thursday: Rain chances continue to be with us, though only at about 20%. It will be cloudy with a high near 84°. The N-NE wind will be around 5-10 mph.

Overnight the rain chance goes up to 40%. The E-NE wind will be 5-10 mph, and the low temp by morning will be around 67°.

Rest of the week: Friday will bring the second big rain chance of the week. We see a 50% chance of rain with a light east wind of 5-10 mph. The high should be 84°.

Saturday will be partly sunny, but there is still a 20% rain chance and a likely high around 89°. The wind will be light S-SE at 5-10 mph all weekend.

Sunday will be mostly sunny and up to about 90°, but the 20% rain chance is still there.

City Council Meeting

Lampasas City Council had their regular 4th Monday meeting on Tuesday this month because of the holiday on Monday.

The workshop session saw the Council discussing the matters of the regular sessions in depth. In the regular session the Council recognized the Lampasas Public Library for earning the Branding Iron Award given by the Texas Library Association for creating a special event, The Painted Chairs Fundraiser. Also recognized were the State qualifiers from the Lampasas High School golf, cross country, track, and powerlifting teams.

Behind the State Champ just a bit in the race was Ace Whitehead, and Dylan Alpha was also part of the 4x200M relay team at the meet.



After recognizing the athletes, the City Council addressed boards and department reports, then discussed potential members for a

Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee, which should come up again at the next Council meeting.

The Council approved the Chamber of Commerce request for Hotel Occupancy Tax Funds in the amount of \$2,718.31 for expenses of the Annual "Hot as Hell" BBQ Cookoff during Spring Ho. Another Chamber request for \$1,400 was also approved for the Spring Ho "Toughest 10K."

There was also discussion on the development of the new Burger King drive in eatery that is in the negotiation stage, as is a development known as Brodie Estates. The development involves 20+ acres in the area of Brown and Cloud streets in the SE part of town. Much of the needed infrastructure in that development may be seen as benefitting the City, and future study may determine that the

Lampasas County Commissioners met Tuesday morning and heard from Heart of Texas Defense Alliance' spokesperson Keith Sledd on the planned extension of I14 through Lampasas Co. As of now, I 14 runs for 23 miles from Copperas Cove to Belton. Sledd said that at some point I14 will run through Lampasas county and the city of Lampasas. The next project in this area will be the widening of Hwy 190 to four lanes instead of 2. The hope is to start that work in 2021.

A proposal to amend the date for the increase from 25.74 to \$40 per day fee for City, or other inmates, to be held in Lampasas Co. jail was changed to take effect from July 1st to October 1st 2019

During public comments Jo Corcoran and Diana Hodges were there to speak on the atlas 4000 bike ride coming up. At the moment they have around 500 cyclists signed up but expect there to be as many at 1000. They will be passing thru Lampasas in waves about every 2 minutes.
