Today: A 20% chance of rain this morning, cloudy and up to 82° this afternoon with north wind 5-10 mph.

Getting Ready for the Ride



The Texas 4000 Bike Ride is coming back to town on Saturday morning, showing up early at Campbell Park.. What's it all about – besides seeing a lot of bicycle riders in town?

The Texas 4000 is a student bike ride (started at the University of Texas and made up of student riders) that goes all the way from Austin to Anchorage, Alaska.

The ride cultivates student leaders and engages communities along the 4,000 mile bike path to join together in the fight against Cancer. It raises a lot of money through sponsorships and events along the way.

It is notable that Lampasas is perhaps the biggest, and the first, of the events.

The official bike team consists of 84 riders but they will be joined in various ways along their way by local riders and community events. The ride starts for the team in Austin early Saturday morning. The City of Austin is celebrating the start of the event today and thru tomorrow.

On Saturday morning the entire team will show up in Lampasas for what is known as the ATLAS Ride. Here, there is a 25 and a 50 mile ride planned, where hundreds of area bike riders will join the team for those rides, then celebrate the day together with a

festival-like event at Campbell Park.

After Lampasas, the Texas 4000 team will split into three groups and go through three different paths thru America and Canada on their way to Anchorage.

While in Lampasas, the area bike riders and the official Texas 4000 team, and lots of community members, will enjoy food (BBQ & beer) and music and fun. There is a Kid's Ride, followed by a Kids Zone for fun at the finish line. And, there'll be a presentation by the Texas 4000 bike rider team.

The center for the event is at Campbell Park at 501 E. North Ave. here in Lampasas. The riders will be getting in place early, 8:30am, and the festivities will begin at 11am.

Lampasas is proud to be the first host and a kickoff City for the Texas 4000 and its quest.

It will bring many hundreds of people to town for one reason or the other. We urge the public to watch for the bikes as they come into Lampasas Saturday morning along Hwy 183 and down Key Avenue. We also urge the public to, in whatever way they can, support the cause of beating Cancer.

Drive Clean

As summer kicks off, Texans love to roll the windows down and hit the road for a breath of fresh air. The Texas Department of Transportation's "Drive Clean Texas" campaign asks all drivers to do their part to make sure every breath is clean and healthy all summer long.

Emissions from cars and trucks can make up close to half of the air pollution in some parts of the state. Three areas in Texas already don't meet federal clean air standards - Houston/Galveston, Dallas/Fort Worth and El Paso. In addition, Austin, San Antonio, Victoria, Tyler/Longview, Beaumont/Port Arthur and Corpus Christi are close to that point. That's why TxDOT developed the Drive Clean Texas campaign, designed to show how simple changes in driving behavior can have a big impact on air quality.

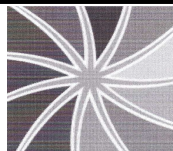

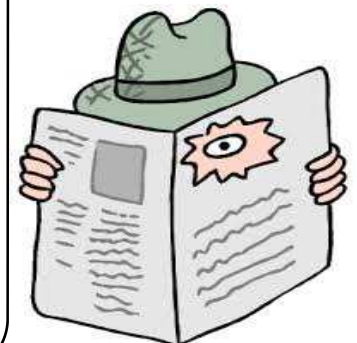

D. Neil Weems, 84, passed from this life to the next on May 25, 2019 in his home.

He was born January 11, 1935 in Stamford, TX in the hospital. He is the son of Virgil Elec Weems and Lula Myrtle McClure who resided in Roby, TX. His father was a farmer and ranch manager and they lived where work took them, including Roby and Cross Plains, before finally settling in Portales, New Mexico where Neil attended High School and owned a Texaco Station.

From Portales, he moved to Las Cruces in March 1958 and worked for Raytheon Service Company at the White Sands Missile Range (WSMR). He worked there until 1968, living in Las Cruces and raising a family that grew to five children.

In 1968, Neil took an assignment in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, opening an entirely new world for himself and family. After five years there, and two in Iran, he returned to Las Cruces, then El Paso, working in the Raytheon office. He continued his overseas travels to Kuwait for another 5 years before coming back to El Paso where he continued work at Raytheon and lived there until his retirement from Raytheon in 1989, after 31 years of service.

Neil started a new chapter of his life in Lampasas. They had bought a ranch three miles south of Adamsville in preparation for retirement and moved to the ranch in 1989. They raised cattle, Boar goats, the occasional hog, chickens, watermelons and a plethora of dogs.

Neil was active in the Adamsville Volunteer Fire Department, serving as its President for many years. He was active in the Adamsville Baptist Church, and it was there that he experienced a spiritual reawakening, rededicating himself to a life in Christ.

Neil is survived by his wife of 42 years, Linda Gene Stapleton; his children Erma Brooks, Kerry Weems (Jean), Charleese Calkins (Jeff), Lyndon Weems (Deena) and David McCullough (Christie); twelve grandchildren, Brandon Brooks (Celina), Angela Brooks, Dallas Weems (Mary), Preston Calkins, Dilan Jones (Chris), Peter Weems, Claire Shaffer (Scott), Dustyn Weems, Ross Weems (Johnna), Rachel Calkins, Anna Veltri (Joe), Adrian McCullough and six great-grandchildren.

He was previously married to Anita Brown who also survives him. He was preceded in death by his parents; sister Demarys Weems; a son Matt Emmett Weems; granddaughter Devon Weems and grandson Orion Weems.

Neil's funeral service will be at Adamsville Baptist Church on Saturday, June 1 at 10am. Interment will follow at Oak Hill Cemetery. Visitation will be Friday from 5 to 7pm at Sneed Funeral Home.
