Governor Sends Resources Amid Protests

Governor Greg Abbott activated the National Guard Saturday in response to the violent protests across the state. Houston, Dallas, San Antonio and Austin saw state resources sent to their cities. Sunday saw Governor Abbott declaring a State of Disaster for all Texas counties. With this declaration, the Governor has the ability to designate Federal Agents to serve as Peace Officers amid the violent protests across the state.

Governor Abbott made this statement:

"Every Texan and every American has the right to protest and I encourage all Texans to exercise their First Amendment rights," said Governor Abbott. "However, violence against others and the destruction of property is unacceptable and counterproductive. As protests have turned violent in various areas across the state, it is crucial that we maintain order, uphold public safety, and protect against property damage or loss. By authorizing additional federal agents to serve as Texas Peace Officers we will help protect people's safety while ensuring that peaceful protesters can continue to make their voices heard."

Sunday also saw Governor Abbot send a significant number of resources across the state, and the FBI has sent tactical teams to assist state and local law enforcement. One thousand National Guard troops are now in place to help the DPS and local law enforcement with their efforts. This all in addition to the resources sent on Saturday

The Lampasas ISD School Board has a regular meeting this evening at 6pm in the Lampasas ISD Administration Building. The Agenda includes a reorganization of the Board, the consent agenda which includes notification of resignation of professional personnel, a budget amendment, the student code of conduct, adjustment to compensation schedule for 2020-2021, and security cameras from elementary campuses.

Other matters include a list of bills, breakfast and lunch pricing, enrollment and curriculum reports, and possible consultation with attorney and consideration of petition for detachment/annexation, and a possible resolution regarding real property.

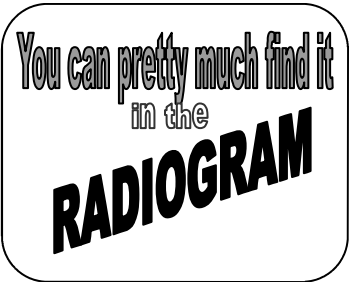

Peaceful Protest

Hundreds of people gathered in an empty parking lot on South Fort Hood Street in Killeen to protest police brutality and the death of George Floyd on Sunday evening according to KWTX. The protest lasted more than four hours.

The protest was complete with guest speakers including Representative Brad Buckley, Killeen Mayor Jose Segarra, City Council Member Debbie Nash King, and Police Chief Charles Kimble.

Organizer Jonathan Hildner said the peaceful protest could not have been done without local law enforcement.

"They've been extremely supportive of us," he said.

"It's nice to see our local law enforcement setting an example and helping us protest peacefully and safely."

Kimble shared some words about how the community and law enforcement should stand together in the wake of police brutality and racial injustice.

"As a human, a policeman and a black man, I'm disgusted," he said.

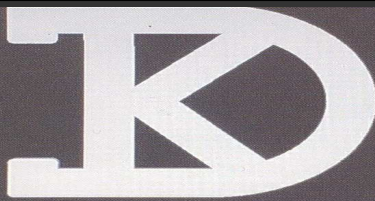
"We want you to know that we stand with you. We want to make sure you have the right to say what you want to say."
