## The Weather

## Governor Abbott, U.S. Attorneys Announce Federal Prosecution For Protest Agitators Violating Federal Law

This press was released on Monday from the Governor Abbott's Website:

"Governor Greg Abbott, along with all four United States Attorneys in Texas, announced today that individuals who come to Texas from out of state to engage in looting, violence, or other destructive acts in violation of federal law will be subject to federal prosecution. Anyone who is arrested and charged with such offenses will be transferred to federal custody. The United States Attorneys will be working with local prosecutors and law enforcement officials to aggressively identify crimes that violate federal law. The four United States Attorneys joining this announcement are: John F. Bash, Erin Nealy Cox, Stephen J. Cox, and Ryan K. Patrick".

"Texans must be able to exercise their First Amendment rights without fear of having agitators, including those coming from out-of-state, hijack their peaceful protest," said Governor Abbott and the U.S. Attorneys. "Today's announcement will ensure there are harsh consequences for those breaking the law and that they will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."

## District Court Notes

**Lampasas County Courthouse** was the site of a 27<sup>th</sup> District Court Docket Call on May 29<sup>th</sup>. Presiding over the Court was 27<sup>th</sup> district Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 5 cases were brought to the court, 4 of them involved men and one involved a woman. There were 3 cases involving possession of a controlled substance, 2 for PG1 and 1 for PG2. There was one case for theft of a firearm and one for evading arrest w/a vehicle.

Of the 5 cases presented to the court, 4 of them were settled with Hanna Bruns pleading no contest to a state jail felony and receiving 4 years of probation. William Landers of Lampasas pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and was sentenced to 15 months state jail with credit for days given served. Brandon Zirkle pleading guilty to theft of a firearm and was sentenced to 10 months state jail with credit for days served. David Barczy, of Lampasas plead guilty to evading arrest w/a vehicle and was sentenced to 10 years TDCJ probated plus fines/costs.

One other case was reset.

## AdventHealth Yoga Classes Reopen

As Texas begins to reopen, AdventHealth Rollins Brook will resume its free yoga classes at the Lampasas County Higher Education Center on Mondays at 7 a.m. and Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m.

All health and safety guidelines suggested by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and state and local health agencies will be followed.

"We are excited to start reconnecting with our communities," said Sarah Kennedy, wellness coordinator at AdventHealth Rollins Brook and AdventHealth Central Texas. "We hope that the class will provide a safe environment where people can connect with one another while being active."

The yoga classes will be led by Laura Smith, certified clinical yoga therapist at AdventHealth. Trained in Yin yoga, a slow placed version of the exercise that focuses on holding certain poses for a period of time, Smith says the classes can accommodate participants with skill levels ranging from beginner to advanced.
