The Weather

Today: Partly sunny skies with a high temperature near 90° and a 30% chance of showers and storms this afternoon. Wind will be NE at 5-10 mph.

Escaped Inmate is Dead

Escaped TDCJ prisoner Gonzalo Lopez is dead after a shoot out with police in Jourdanton, according to authorities.

Law enforcement received a call from a resident near Centerville in Leon County, who was worried about an elderly relative they had not heard from. When officers arrived at the residence, the bodies of one adult and four children were found. The resident's late 90s model Chevrolet pick-up was missing. Authorities in Atascosa County spotted the pick up, later in the evening, and a pursuit began. Lopez eventually wrecked the vehicle, coming out firing a weapon at the law enforcement officers in the town of Jourdanton. The officers fired back at Lopez, killing him. Law enforcement states that he was armed with an AR-15 and several pistols. It is believed they were stolen from the home of the murder victims.

Lopez has been on the run since May 12th when he escaped from a prison transport bus on Highway 7 west of Centerville as they were headed to a medical appointment in Huntsville. He was in a caged area of the bus designed for high risk inmates, and somehow freed himself from leg and hand restraints, cut through the expanded metal of the cage and crawled out the bottom. He then gained access to the driver and attacked him. The driver stopped the bus and they both exited the bus. The officer in the rear of the bus jumped out as well, and Lopez jumped back on the bus and drove away, with one of the officers shooting out the rear tires. The bus traveled a little way down the road, and when it would not go any further, Lopez exited the bus and ran into the woods.

Sixteen prisoners were on the bus but no one else escaped.

Leon County is approximately 50 miles north of Huntsville.



TEA Directed to Ensure Schools are Safe

Governor Greg Abbott yesterday sent a letter to Commissioner Mike Morath directing the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to ensure existing school facilities are held to heightened safety standards following the recent tragedy at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde.

"In the wake of this devastating crime, we must redouble our efforts to ensure that our schools provide a safe and secure environment for the children of Texas," reads the letter. "You should immediately prepare additional rules to ensure that existing school facilities are also held to heightened safety standards. We must do everything possible to protect children and safeguard our schools."

Governor Abbott specifically requested TEA to:

- *instruct school districts to identify actions they can take prior to the start of the new school year that will make their campuses more secure

- *instruct all school districts to conduct weekly inspections of exterior doors to verify they are secure during school hours

- *develop strategies to encourage school districts to increase the presence of trained law enforcement officers and school marshals on campuses

How to Stretch Your Gas Dollar

President Biden announced Tuesday that the U.S. is banning imports of Russian oil and gas, so Americans can expect higher prices at the pump.

The same day, the average gas price in the United States was over \$4, according to AAA, In Texas, the average is about \$3.85.

For those whose wallets may be stretching thin, we've compiled a list of things you can do to save a couple cents at the pump.

GetUpside app: While there are many apps out there that tell you

where to get the cheapest gas prices, GetUpside can help you save up to 25 cents a gallon. How you can save up to this much: Take a photo of your receipt in the app to get the savings. Without a photo, you can save by using the feature called "check in."

Loyalty programs: Stores like Sam's Club and Walmart offer members discounted prices at the pump. For example, Walmart+ members can get a 5-cent discount.

For Texans, H-E-B offers a "Points Club Rewards" membership at no charge where you earn points for every dollar you spend. In turn, you can use these points at the pump to get a little discount on gas.

7-Eleven also has a program that will give you a discount of 11 cents a gallon for the first seven fill-ups on all fuel grades.

Pay in cash: It's always worth asking if a gas station offers cheaper gas if you pay with cash. If they do, you could possibly save up to 5 to 10 cents a gallon.

Buy gas on certain days: Another way to save at the pump is by filling up on certain days and then avoiding the pumps on others. In Texas, the cheapest day to fill up is on Sunday while the most expensive day is Thursday, according to experts.
