

The Blotter

(cont'd from front) lawmakers removed the rule from Texas code.

Texas is one of 13 states that mandate annual inspections for cars. That will change in about 18 months now that the Texas Legislature has given final approval to House Bill 3297. Supporters of the bill called the safety inspections time consuming and inconvenient. Opponents of the bill say it could set Texas drivers, and future Texans, on a dangerous path.

The Legislature repealed provisions in state law that mandate annual vehicle inspections. However, the \$7.50 fee remains intact under a new name: the inspection program replacement fee.

The 17 Texas counties that require emissions inspections will still mandate annual tests regardless of the bill becoming law. These are Brazoria, Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, El Paso, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Johnson, Kaufman, Montgomery, Parker, Rockwall, Tarrant, Travis and Williamson counties. All Texas drivers outside of the exempted counties stand to be affected by the legislation.

(Texas Tribune) The 2023 Texas legislative session came to a stunning end when tense negotiations on property taxes and border issues between lawmakers broke down at the last minute, leading Gov. Greg Abbott to call for an immediate special session.

be passed by the Legislature and would require multiple special sessions. A school voucher plan, one of Abbott's main priorities this session, also fizzled out before the session's end.

The last days of the sessions were also overshadowed by the Texas House's historic vote to impeach Attorney General Ken Paxton.

Lawmakers did pass bills banning puberty blockers and hormone treatments for transgender children, allowing prosecutors to pursue murder charges against people who sell fentanyl and eliminating diversity, equity and inclusion offices on public university campuses. In addition, the legislators passed a \$321.3 billion state budget, allocating money toward tax cuts, mental health access and infrastructure for broadband and water. To help pay for the budget, they allocated half of the record \$32.7 billion surplus they had at their disposal.

A Bit of Yesteryear

With the creation of the Model T Ford in 1908, owning an automobile was affordable for most with one selling for as little as \$350. The world had become mobile.

So in 1921, a Texas businessman named Jessie Kirby created the first drive-in restaurant outside of Dallas called the Pig Stand. Much like the proliferation of the automobile, drive in restaurants started popping up all over the country. But It wasn't until 1948 when Harry and Esther Snyder took the concept one step further with the first drive-thru, which was the In-N-Out Burger in Baldwin Park, California.

What's the Lampasas connection? In 1950, Jim Storm and his wife, IraDell, were operating a diner in San Antonio when they decided to move to Lampasas, and on September 23, 1950, they opened The Dairy Cue. If you were born after 1970, you know the drive-in as Storms which is in the original location from the 1950s. The photo (below) is of The Dairy Cue with a new 1960 Chevrolet Impala pulled in for more than likely a juicy hamburger and shake. (Picture courtesy of Lampasas Heritage Foundation).
