The Weather



High yesterday was 91° Low this morning was 68°

Look for highs today and tomorrow in the mid 90's with heat values as high as 100-103°. Tropical Storm Cristobal is expected to impact far East Texas on Monday as it moves inland. However, Central Texas will have another hot day in the 90's. Tuesday is expected to be the first 100° day in our area as the tropical storm moves east and we have compressional heating from an incoming front that is forecast to move through our area Tuesday night.

Today: Sunny with light winds becoming east in the afternoon. The high temperature will be near 94° with a heat index close to 97°.

Tonight: Mostly clear with E winds near 5-10. The low will be near 73°.

Sunday: Mostly sunny and a high temperature near 95° and the heat index reaching near 100°. Winds will be E-NE at 5-10 mph.

Sunday Night: Mostly clear with a low temperature near 72° and light NE breezes.

Monday: Skies will be sunny with the high temperature near 98°. Winds will be NE at near 5 mph in the afternoon.

Monday Night: A low near 76° and clear skies. Wind will be S-SE at 5 mph.

Tuesday: Sunny with a high temperature near 104°.

Monday Meetings

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court will have a regular meeting at 9am Monday in the Commissioners

Courtroom. The agenda includes: The consent agenda, accounts payable and payroll, 2020 Spring Ho Resolution, Preliminary Plat Race Riverbend Subdivision, Replat of a portion of lot 6 block 1 of Allen Estates #1, Fire Marshal's Pickup Truck, a request from Lometa Volunteer Fire Dept. for use of county resources, surplus property, an order prohibiting/restricting certain fireworks in unincorporated areas of Lampasas County, authorization for additional services from architect on the Jail Project, proposed takeover agreement with surety, traveler's insurance, and a report and notification from Central Counties Services on the Executive Director Salary.

The Commissioner's will also have a workshop session Monday at 1:30pm to review the renewal of employee benefits/Texas Association of Counties Health and Employee Benefits Pool.

The Lampasas City Council will meet in a workshop session at 5:30pm for discussion of the following; draft ordinance for commercial parking in residential areas, city projects, re-opening and use of public facilities as Texas re-opens, and any item on the regular meeting agenda.

City Council will meet in regular session at 6pm and that meeting will include a public hearing to receive citizen comments regarding a request to consider a Specific Use Permit to allow for an *Open Storage, Display, or Work Area for Merchandise of Machinery* in an area zoned Retail. The property is commonly known as 108 S. Key Ave. Following the public hearing the agenda will include; the consent agenda, department reports, the City Managers Operational Report to include Brodie Estates, and the business park. New business



will include discussion and possible action on the following; an ordinance for commercial parking in residential areas, the Chamber of Commerce HOT fund request, reinstatement of utility late fees and disconnection of electric/water due to non-payment, a deed correction, the SUP for 108 S. Key and the appointment of a board member to the planning & zoning commission.

Mr. Arl Gordon Hightower, 98 of Clifton, Texas died Friday June 5 at Clifton Lutheran Sunset Home.

He was born December 7, 1921 in Moline, Texas the son of Arl Richard Hightower and Viola Mae (Reeder) Hightower. He spent the majority of his life in the Lometa area, where he was ranch foreman for 48 years for the Bohning family all while driving a Lometa School bus for about 25 years.
