# The Weather



### The High yesterday $81^\circ$ $\,$ The Low this morning $64^\circ$

**Today:** Look for mostly sunny skies with a high near 86° and a 30% chance of showers this afternoon. E-NE wind will be near 5 mph.

**Tonight:** Look for mostly clear skies with the low dropping to about 65° by morning and the 30% chance of showers continuing into the evening. Wind will be E-NE near 5-10 mph shifting W overnight.

**Wednesday:** Mostly sunny skies with a high temperature near 88° with a slight chance of precipitation in the afternoon. Look for wind to become NE near 5 mph.

**Wednesday Night:** Look for partly cloudy skies with a low near 67° and a light S-SW wind. The slight chance of showers continues.

**Thursday:** Sunny skies and the high will be near  $92^{\circ}$  with W-SW wind near 5 mph.

# June 6, 1944: D-Day

**From history.com: 79 years ago, on June 6, 1944,** Supreme Allied Commander General Dwight D. Eisenhower gave the go-ahead for the largest amphibious military operation in history: Operation Overlord, the Allied invasion of northern France, commonly known as D-Day.

By daybreak, 18,000 British and American parachutists were already on the ground. An additional 13,000 aircraft were mobilized to provide air cover and support for the invasion. At 6:30 a.m., American troops came ashore at Utah and Omaha beaches.

The task was toughest at Omaha beach where the U.S. First Division battled high seas, mist, mines, burning vehicles—and German coastal batteries, including an elite infantry division, which spewed heavy fire.

By day's end, 155,000 Allied troops–Americans, British and Canadians–had successfully stormed Normandy's beaches and were then able to push inland.

Before the Allied assault, Hitler's armies had been in control of most of mainland Europe and the Allies knew that a successful invasion of the continent was central to winning the war. Hitler knew this too, and was expecting an assault on northwestern Europe in the spring of 1944.

The Germans suffered from confusion in the ranks and the absence of celebrated commander Field Marshal Erwin Rommel, who was away on leave. Hitler hesitated in calling for armored divisions to help in the defense. In addition, the Germans were hampered by effective Allied air support, which took out many key bridges and forced the Germans to take long detours. Though D-Day did not go off exactly as planned, for example, the Allies were able to land only fractions of the supplies and vehicles they had intended in France–the invasion was a decided success. By the end of June, the Allies had 850,000 men and 150,000 vehicles in Normandy and were poised to continue their march across Europe.





# **Texas House Bill 2127**

Texas House Bill 2127 is headed for the Governor's desk. If signed into law, it would nullify some rules made to protect workers.

According to The Texas Tribune, the legislation would overturn any existing regulation that conflicts with it. Opponents say the bill would wipe out mandated water breaks for construction workers in some cities and water-use restrictions during droughts. They warn that local governments would no longer be able to combat predatory lending or invasive species, regulate excessive noise or enforce nondiscrimination ordinances.

Supporters of the bill have said local regulations create a patchwork of different rules across the state that can weigh heavy on business owners and ultimately harm the state's economy.

State Sen. Brandon Creighton, who is carrying the bill in the upper chamber, said on Monday that HB 2127 is about reining in city leaders that exceed their authority.

"Our businesses are panicking, coming in to our hearings and calling in to our offices saying we have to lay people off," Creighton said. "We cannot keep up with the compliance differences up and down [Interstate Highway] 35 alone in the different municipalities that have set these different ordinances."

If Gov. Greg Abbott signs HB 2127, it will take effect on Sept. 1.

# Microsoft Fined \$20 Million

(AP) Microsoft will pay a fine of \$20 million to settle Federal Trade Commission charges that it illegally collected and retained the data of children who signed up to use its Xbox video game console.

The agency charged that Microsoft gathered the data without notifying parents or obtaining their consent, and that it also illegally held onto the data. Those actions violated the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act, the FTC stated.

In a blog post, Microsoft corporate vice president for Xbox Dave McCarthy outlined additional steps the company is now taking to improve its age verification systems and to ensure that parents are involved in the creation of child accounts for the service. These mostly concern efforts to improve age verification technology and to educate children and parents about privacy issues.

McCarthy also said the company had identified and fixed a technical glitch that failed to delete child accounts in cases where the account creation process never finished. Microsoft policy was to hold that data no longer than 14 days in order to allow players to pick up account creation where they left off if they were interrupted.

The settlement must be approved by a federal court before it can go into effect, the FTC said.
