Lampasas ISD School Board Meeting

The Lampasas ISD Board of Trustees voted unanimously this past Tuesday, June 7th, to approve new curriculum materials for human sexuality instruction at the 6th, 7th, and 8th-grade levels; appointed election judges; approved the Burnet Central County Appraisal District's acquisition of property; and approved a list of routine consent agenda items.

Further discussion was held regarding a list of proposed revisions to the current Board Policy EIC (Local) as well as several school safety and security improvements in response to the recent tragedy in Uvalde.

In addition, many teachers were recognized at the Tuesday meeting as Teachers of the Year on both a campus and a district level. For teachers of the year from Taylor Creek- Vickie McQueen, Kline Whitis-Kaitlin Kendrick, LMS- Amanda Schwabe, LHS Megan Achee and also Jaden Napolez. Recognized on a district level were Chelsea Posey (Hanna Springs) and Marie McGuire(LMS). Also recognized were several students for outstanding UIL academic achievement.

A budget workshop immediately followed the meeting at 7 PM.

LCRA Awards Grants

The Lower Colorado River Authority recently awarded more than \$815,000 in Community Development Partnership Program grants for a wide range of projects across LCRA's wholesale electric, water and transmission service areas.

The grants will help fund 36 community projects, including new fire trucks in Lee and Tom Green counties, a new trailhead and outdoor classroom in Early, renovations to a decades-old kitchenette at the Columbus public library and a new splash pad at Lavaca Swimming Pool in Hallettsville.

LCRA General Manager Phil Wilson said the grants help support important community projects that otherwise may not be funded.

"These projects contribute to the health, safety and development of local communities," Wilson said. "Whether it's providing new rescue equipment for first responders or replacing an outdated playscape at a community park, these projects help improve lives and support communities across the LCRA service territory."

Fifteen projects will support first responders by providing personal protective equipment, emergency vehicles and additional critical resources such as rescue tools and transport ventilators.

"First responders need protective gear, reliable equipment and fully functional vehicles ready to go at a moment's notice, and LCRA is proud to assist," Wilson said. "These grants will help first responders act quickly and operate safely as they work to protect their communities."

To date, LCRA has awarded 1,888 community grants totaling more than \$48.7 million. When combined with almost \$230 million in community-raised matching funds, the program has invested more than \$278 million in local communities.

Escapee Had a Key

(KXXV) Texas cartel killer Gonzalo Lopez had a homemade knife and a key before escaping from a prison bus cage, attacking an officer, crashing the bus and then fleeing into the woods, a state senator said Tuesday.

Lopez, who killed a family of five before he was gunned down by law enforcement near San Antonio on Thursday, made other inmates on the bus aware of his plans ahead of time, said State Sen. John Whitmire (D-Houston).

The 16 inmates on board "started making a disturbance, singing and jumping up and down" prior to Lopez's escape, Whitmire said.

Lopez told "other inmates he was going to escape and 'this is your opportunity,'" Whitmire said. The officers were distracted, and the driver was watching the road, while Lopez was releasing his restraints, and then while he was "breaking out of the little cage he was in," Whitmire said. The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Tuesday shows a report of a burglary of a business in the 100 block of N. Main at 10:47am, and a harassment reported in the 900 block of E. Ave G at 11:36am. There was a minor accident in the 200 block of N. Key at 11:46am. The afternoon shows a suspicious person in the 800 block of N. Ridge St. at 2:13pm, and another minor accident at the intersection of S. Key and 6th St. at 5:24pm. There was a criminal trespass in the 200 block of N. (cont'd from front) 25 News asked the state's most senior senator if the same key was used for the killer's restraints and the metal cage aboard the bus. "Same key for both I understand," Whitmire said.

Officials with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice previously said the escaped killer used a makeshift knife to both cut his way through restraints and the cage on the bus.

Criminal charges could be filed against some of the inmates, Whitmire said. "Lopez was the worst of the worst," and there were "huge mistakes made," Whitmire said.

Whitmire said the key hasn't been recovered and that either an inmate took it or that it was "lost in the shuffle."

Robert Hurst, TDCJ spokesman, said he couldn't comment further "about a key beyond what the senator has told your news operation because of the ongoing investigation."

"No one has been placed 'on leave,'" Hurst said. "One officer is on an approved leave (he requested it) and the other officer is back at work."

Meanwhile, Whitmire said 2,000 inmates travel on the roads of Texas each day – half for medical-related reasons. The state of Texas has 98 prisons and 120,000 inmates.

Copyright Suit Against Top Gun:Maverick

"Good morning aviators," Tom Cruise says in a line from blockbuster Top Gun: Maverick. "This is your captain speaking. Today's exercise is dogfighting."

There is now a legal fight between the film's box office high-flyer Paramount Pictures and the Israeli-based widow and son of the author of the 1983 article that inspired the original 1986 movie.

In a copyright suit filed Monday in California federal court, Shosh Yonay and Yuval Yonay want unspecified but clearly big-bucks damages from the studio and, with a very odd sense of timing, an injunction to stop screenings and distribution of the May 27-released sequel, as well as any more movies in the franchise.

Calling Top Gun: Maverick "derivative," the Marc Toberoff- and Alex Kozinski-represented Yonays allege that Paramount is "thumbing its nose at the statute" that allows the termination of rights after 35 years (read the court complaint here).

"These claims are without merit, and we will defend ourselves vigorously," said a Paramount spokesperson today in response. The studio will obviously have to respond to the suit in the federal docket in due course.

In the May 1983 edition of California magazine, Ehud Yonay penned "Top Guns," about the pilots and program "located in a second-floor cubby of offices at the east end of Hangar One at Miramar." The piece was optioned ASAP and Yonay was cited in the credits of the first Top Gun.

All cool as Iceman so far, right?

Well, yes, but then you get to the long-delayed Top Gun: Maverick, and the rights to the article reverting back to the Yonays in January 2020.

"Despite the 2022 Sequel clearly having derived from the Story, Paramount consciously failed to secure a new license of film and ancillary rights in the copyrighted Story following the Yonays' recovery of their U.S. copyright on January 24, 2020," reads the three-claim, jury trial-demanding civil complaint. "The Yonays contend and Paramount denies that the 2022 Sequel does not qualify for the "prior derivative works exception" under 17 U.S.C. because it was not completed until long after January 24, 2020."

So we have ourselves a showdown...
