Lampasas County Sheriff's Dept. Press Release

On June 8, 2022 at approximately 10:36pm, Lampasas County Sheriff's Office received a call from a citizen residing at the 100 block of PR 4816. The citizen advised while she was out on her nature walk she observed a small female toddler standing on CR 4820 near the PR 4816 intersection. The child appeared to be alone and was in danger standing in the middle of CR 4820. The citizen immediately grabbed the child and took her to safety, and began contacting neighbors via cell phone to inquire who this toddler might belong to. All Lampasas County Sheriff's Deputies were busy with other calls at the time, so Kempner Police Officer Austin Beckett responded to the call. When the police officer and resident checked a residence on CR 4820, they located a Tahoe SUV parked behind some utility trailers, at a residence located at the 800 block of CR 4820. The vehicle's driver's door was open and the vehicle was observed running. The Officer also observed a car seat in the Tahoe. While at that location, the owner of the residence arrived and inquired why the police were there. He was advised they were trying to find the parents to the toddler. He immediately checked the inside of this residence and learned a female friend of his, Tara L. Hazlett, 34 was inside sitting on his couch and she appeared to be inebriated under the influence of alcohol. When Hazlett was questioned if she knew where her child was at, she responded her daughter was in her vehicle. Hazlett was not very coherent at this time and was not aware that her 24 month old daughter had apparently gotten out of her car seat and exited the vehicle looking for her mother.

Lampasas County Sheriff's Sergeant Jerome Ervin responded and took charge of the investigation. Hazlett was arrested for endangerment to a child and was taken to the Lampasas County Jail to be booked in. Acadian EMS was dispatched to the location where they evaluated the child. Precautionalry measures were taken, so the child was taken to Advent Hospital Emergency in

Lampasas for further medical evaluation. Child Protective Services was summoned and they responded to Advent Hospital where they took custody and control of the toddler. While searching Hazlett's body during the booking procedures at the county jail, a controlled substance was found in her underwear. Hazlett was charged with Endangerment of a Child, a 2nd degree felony and possession of a dangerous drug, a class A misdemeanor. Hazlett will be arraigned in the morning. A special thanks to the citizen for taking her nature walk at the right time and for securing the safety of this child.

Out in the county there were medical calls, civil matters, animal issues, a report of lost/found property, requested welfare checks, reports of suspicious activity, juvenile problems, reported disturbances and a warrant was served. Deputies went into Cove on a report of criminal mischief.

(cont'd from front) shootings such as in San Bernardino, California, and Orlando, Florida. The review will assess the law enforcement response and "give guidance for the future," Garland said. The department will then produce a public report, which will include the investigation's findings and recommendations.

Garland said the team reviewing the law enforcement response will conduct site visits to the school and interviews with witnesses, families, law enforcement officers and school officials.

He said that his department expects full cooperation from all law enforcement officers involved in the response to the shooting. Authorities have been criticized in the days after the massacre over their decision to wait over an hour before entering the school and confronting the shooter.

"We have been promised, assured and welcomed with respect to cooperation by every level of law enforcement: state, federal and local," Garland said. "We will participate in that vein and we don't expect any problems."

The federal review of the law enforcement response is in addition to a separate investigation by the Texas Rangers that looks into the shooting and the law enforcement response.

Less than a week after the May 24 shooting in Uvalde, where 19 students and two teachers were killed in their classrooms during the last week of the school year, the Justice Department announced it would be conducting a review of law enforcement's response to the incident. The federal probe was requested by Uvalde Mayor Don McLaughlin soon after authorities started facing criticism over their response to the incident.

The Texas Department of Public Safety previously said Arredondo, Uvalde CISD Police Chief, is not cooperating with state investigators' requests for information, but Arredondo has contested the claim

In a Wednesday statement, McLaughlin thanked federal authorities for conducting the review and promised the city will "fully cooperate" with the probe

Investors Buying Homes

According to a new report, the Texas housing market is heating up with investors now purchasing about every one in four homes.

Indeed, investors are turning to the Lone Star State just as a new generation of Texans arrives. Comparatively, Texas ranks No. 1 across the nation in the number of investors buying residential homes. Areas like Bexar County, home to the Spurs and Six Flags, saw "institutional investors" purchasing 46 percent of all homes sold last year.

Institutional investors are defined as, "companies, corporations or limited liability companies," according to the report. Meanwhile, the state's third most populated area, Tarrant County, is now reporting that 52 percent of all homes sold last year were to institutional investors as well.

As a state, 28 percent of all homes sold in 2021 were purchased by said investors. Experts shared that one key factor may be "investor-only" listings. Listings where properties in much need of repairs are exclusively sold to investors, before being rented out for years.

Experts noted these properties eventually re-enter the market, but at much higher costs as owners look to recuperate their investments. Nationwide, the entire south is seeing a rise in these investors buying up residential properties.

Georgia, Oklahoma and Alabama are all nearly tied for second place, with about 18 percent of all home purchases in 2021 being done by institutional investors. Last year, the State of Texas saw a 4.6 percent increase in the number of investors owning residential property.

Second in the nation to only Mississippi, which reported a 6.5 percent increase. Overall, roughly 84 percent of the nation saw a jump in this type of home purchasing last year.

This news arrives as both home sales and rental markets continue to suffer from a large under-supply of both unit types.
