The agenda includes the consent agenda, which will include the treasurer's quarterly report and monthly departmental reports. The agenda also includes accounts payable and payroll, a presentation from Friends of the Night Sky of Lampasas County, approval for County participation in TAC's free Cyber Security course (to fulfill annual cybersecurity training for county employees), surrendering the construction bond and receiving the maintenance bond for Rylan Ranch subdivision, the fireworks ban order, request bids for diesel, gas and aggregate for surface treatment, an approved contract with the Texas Association of Counties for health insurance and Timbercreek Ranch Subdivision-part B.

The Saratoga Underground Water Conservation District will have a Regular Meeting on Monday June 13th, on the 3rd floor of the Lampasas County Courthouse at 10am.

The agenda includes the Consultant for Management Services title change to General Manager, the Drought Index for 2022, a Well Registrations Update for fiscal year 2022, discussion of the Public Hearing and adopting proposed Rules and Revisions, a TCEQ District Registration Update, Discussion and Update on GMA 8 participation and Lampasas County Funding, a Call for Board of Directors, General and Special Elections on November 8, 2022, the Texas Alliance of Groundwater Districts Membership, Texas Groundwater Summit 2022 conference attendance and adopting/amending the fiscal year 2022 budget

Lampasas City Council to Meet

The Lampasas City Council will meet Monday, June 13th for regular meetings beginning with the Workshop Session at 5:30pm. The agenda for the workshop session includes discussion regarding the Night Skies Initiative, a workforce recruitment/retention plan, the design, cost and progression of the Campbell Park Skatepark, the Hanna Spring wall removal, and the FY 2022/2023 budget.

The regular session will begin at 6pm and the agenda will include the consent agenda which includes the second reading of an ordinance amending appendix A of the City of Lampasas Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, Solid Waste, Article III, billing rates and fees related to the collection of Solid Waste.

The regular agenda includes routine matters to include the City Manager's operational report which addresses the business park, a relief route, the job fair and the police dept.

In New Business there will be discussion and possible action regarding the appeal of ordinance #1672, a workforce retention and recruitment plan including compensation adjustments, the options, costs, progression and continuation of the Campbell Park Skatepark project, the Lampasas Central Appraisal District fiscal year 2022/2023 budget, increase in project costs for the LCRA Lampasas Substation House Upgrade in the amount of \$402,436, replacement of equipment at the Naruna Substation in the amount of \$32,865, and the installation of a pole barn at the Oakhill Cemetery in an amount not to exceed \$30,000. There will also be discussion about considering an alternative form of guarantee for the Hidden Oaks Subdivision for the 2-year maintenance bond for public infrastructure, street and lift station.

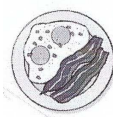

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Friday shows a reported disturbance in the 300 block of Barnes St. at 1:17pm and an assault reported in the 700 block of W. 6th St. at 5:54pm.

Boy, It's Hot Outside

Summer comes with a lot of fun in the sun but it also comes with dangerously high temperatures that could lead to injury. There is a Heat Advisory in effect from Noon today until 7pm tomorrow, Sunday June 14th.

"You know the first heat-related illness is dehydration. That's one we have all experienced and if not, then we will. There's also heat exhaustion and heat stroke," said Dr. Laura Irvin, Sports Medicine Physician with Baylor Scott & White.

All of which are dangerous with heat stroke being the most severe.

"That can be fatal. So, we do take it very seriously. Signs of that is when someone starts to become confused, they may be sleepy, and again when you stop sweating," said Dr. Irvin.

More than an hour in the hot sun can lead to injuries, making jobs like road construction very dangerous in the summer. It's something TxDOT says they take very seriously.

"TxDOT is always reminding its workers, its crew members, and their contractors that staying safe in the heat is critically important. TxDOT is all about safety. Whether it's for the traveling public or TxDOT personnel or its contractors," said Public Information Officer Jake Smith. That is why TxDOT has a plan in place for crews working in the summer heat.

"Hydrating, wearing sunscreen, ensuring that you are staying safe in that heat, and have a buddy system so you can be on the lookout and observing to see if you see any early signs of heat illness. Taking as many breaks as you need. Just so you can withstand the unrelenting heat we are experiencing right now," said Smith.

If you or someone you know is experiencing severe heat illness, it is important to call 911 immediately and take steps to cool down while you wait.

"Stopping the activity immediately. If there is not a cold tub, put as many cool rags on them as possible. Putting them in the shade or getting them inside. Those are great steps while we're waiting for 911 to respond," said Dr. Irvin.

The big takeaway, if you are working outside drink plenty of water, take breaks when you need to, wear sunscreen, and be on the lookout for any heat-related injuries.

Operation Fly Formula

Yesterday, President Biden announced that his Administration has arranged the sixth Operation Fly Formula flight. Delta Air Lines will transport Kendamil formula free of charge from Heathrow Airport in London to Logan Airport in Boston and Detroit Metro Airport between June 20 and June 24.

These Operation Fly Formula flights donated by Delta will contain more than 212,000 pounds or approximately 3.2 million 8-ounce bottle equivalents of Kendamil infant formula and will begin shipping on June 20.

The Kendamil Organic and Classic formula, made available through Operation Fly Formula, will be distributed and available for purchase at select U.S. retailers nationwide, as well as online. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is exercising enforcement discretion so that Kendamil can import infant formula under the Kendamil brand. Kendamil will export up to at least 2 million cans of Kendamil infant formula – the equivalent of at least 54 million 8-ounce bottles to the United States. Parents can learn more about Kendamil infant formula at <https://kendamil.com/> and visit the United States website at <https://us.kendamil.com/> for updates and information on retail locations.

President Biden launched Operation Fly Formula to speed up the importation of safe infant formula and start getting more formula to stores as soon as possible. Under Operation Fly Formula, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the General Services Administration (GSA), and the Department of Defense (DOD) are partnering to pick up overseas infant formula that meets U.S. health and safety standards so it can get to store shelves faster. Yesterday, Operation Fly Formula flights landed in Texas with 1.6 million bottle equivalents of Nestlé NAN SupremePro Stage 1 infant formula, and the first shipment of 3.7 million bottle equivalents of Kendamil infant formula landed in Virginia aboard a donated United Airlines flight.

In addition, the Biden Administration has taken a number of other important actions to ensure there is enough safe infant formula for families, including invoking the Defense Production Act, entering into a consent agreement between the FDA to reopen Abbott Nutrition's Sturgis facility, and issuing FDA guidance so that major formula manufacturers can safely import formula that is not currently being produced for the U.S. market.
