The Weather



The High Yesterday: 98° The Low This morning 74°

Today: Look for skies to be partly sunny with clearing and a high temperature topping out near 98° with a heat index near 102°. There is a 20% chance of showers and storms this afternoon. S wind will be near 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Tonight brings partly cloudy skies and a 20% chance of precipitation in the evening.

The low temperature will be near 72° and the wind continues from the S at 10-15 mph with possible gusts of 25 mph.

Tuesday: Mostly sunny skies with a high near 99° and a heat index up to 105°. The wind will be from the S-SW at 10-15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Tuesday Night: Look for partly cloudy skies with a low temperature near 72°. The wind will be S near 10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Wednesday: Sunny skies and a forecast high near 98°. Wind will be S near 10 mph shifting NW in the afternoon.

Wednesday Night: Skies will be partly cloudy with a low near 71°. Wind will be E-NE near 10-15 mph becoming S-SE after midnight gusting to 20 mph.

Commissioners Court

The Lampasas County Commissioners Court met this morning at 9am in the Commissioners Courtroom in the

Lampasas County Courthouse.

The Agenda included the consent agenda which included the treasurer's quarterly report and monthly departmental reports. The Agenda also included accounts payable and payroll, the

presentation of the Distinguished Service Award to the Lampasas County Historical Commission, request bids for gas & diesel and aggregate, an updated Interlocal agreement with Burnet County, discussion of the old jail parking lot and a resolution to abandon an old rail line in Lometa.

Lampasas City **Council to Meet**



The Lampasas City Council will meet this afternoon for regularly scheduled meetings beginning at 5:30pm with a joint workshop session to discuss with the Capital Improvement Program's (CIP) fiscal year (FY) 2024-2029 report.

The workshop session will begin immediately following the joint workshop session and the agenda includes discussion regarding: city pools and lap swim fees, the FY 2024 budget, and future street projects. There will be presentations from: LCHEC, HOTDA, Hill Country 100 Club, Hill Country Children's Advocacy Center, WCID and Cooper Spring Nature Park.

The regular session will begin immediately following the workshop session and will begin with presentations and proclamations. The Agenda includes a public hearing for citizen comments on an amendment to the fee schedule for Fire Department permits, inspections and licenses. There will be the second reading of ordinances, one to approve the Lampasas County Recycling program in the amount of \$36 annually and one to approve the rezoning of 1206 Mills St. and 1705 E. 4th St., consistent with the Lampasas Comprehensive Plan.

The City Manager's report will include information on 190 improvements, the Appraisal District, the Hostess House and the Council Workshop.

In new business there will be discussion and possible action including: renewal of the Chamber of Commerce Agreement, acceptance of the FY 2024-2029 CIP report, an increase in wholesale water rates related to capital expenditures, street closures in support of the Rockin' Rides and Smokin' Swing Car Show on July 9th at the Courthouse Square, the approval to lease 15 twoway radios and accessories in an amount not to exceed \$1200, obtaining fencing from United Rentals for the 580 Sports Complex not to exceed \$23,000, the purchase of a John Deere 3032E Utility Tractor for the Parks Department in the amount of \$25,000, changing the Fire Department fees for permits, licenses and inspections. 




