The Weather



Yesterday's high 101° This morning's low 73° The heat index reached 110° yesterday at 5:35pm

Today: Skies will be partly sunny with a high temperature near 98° and a heat index near 107°. There is a 20% chance of precipitation this afternoon. Winds will be from the S-SE near 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Look for cloudy skies clearing a bit overnight with a low near 77° and a 30% chance of showers. Wind will be from the SE near 10-15 mph, with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Sunday: The high temperature will climb to near 103° with mostly sunny skies and a heat index near 108°. Winds will be S-SW at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph, shifting W-NW in the afternoon.

Sunday Night: Overnight it gets down to 76° with mostly clear skies. Wind will become E-NE near 5-10 mph.

Juneteenth: Look for sunny skies with a high temperature near 105°. There will be a S wind at 5-10 mph.

Monday Night: Partly cloudy with a low around 78°. Wind will be S near 10-15 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

The Open House for Lampasas Middle School will be August 8th from 5-6:30pm, and the one for Lampasas High School will be on Tuesday, August 8th from 5:30-7pm. The 1st day of school is August 10th.

Juneteenth Closings

The Holiday of Juneteenth will be observed on Monday. The US Postal Service will be closed along with all the local banks. The First Texas Motor Bank will also be closed today. Lampasas County and City offices will be open, as well as the Radiogram offices.

Heat-Related Safety

Lampasas County is under an excessive heat warning until **8pm** Sunday. This has been extended from the original excessive heat warning. Criteria for an excessive heat warning is a heat index of 110-120 degrees, considered dangerously hot. The Lampasas area recorded the first 100° day of 2023 yesterday at 5:35pm with a high of 101°. The temperature is supposed to reach past the 100° mark through the middle of next week.

Officials are advising for residents to stay indoors with a fan or air conditioning if possible, wear lightweight clothing, limit strenuous activity during the hottest parts of the day, if you are outside, seek shade, avoid caffeine and alcohol (they can cause dehydration), if you are overheated take a cool shower or bath, get plenty of rest, keep hydrated by drinking lots of water and check on others!

New Fentanyl Legislation

Governor Greg Abbott this week signed four pieces of legislation into laws to combat the growing national fentanyl crisis. The legislation was passed during the 88th Regular Legislative Session at the Texas Capitol. The laws signed by the Governor represent a significant step in the state's fight against the deadly opioid.

Bill 6 creates a criminal offense of murder for supplying fentanyl that results in death, enhances the criminal penalty for the manufacturing or delivery of fentanyl, and requires deaths caused by fentanyl to be designated as fentanyl toxicity or fentanyl poisoning on a death certificate.

(cont'd from front) House Bill 3144 establishes October as Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness Month to help increase awareness of the dangers of fentanyl.

House Bill 3908 also known as Tucker's Law, requires public schools each year to provide research-based instruction on fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness to students grades 6 through 12.

Senate Bill 867 allows the distribution of opioid antagonists, including life-saving NARCAN, to Texas colleges and universities to prevent opioid poisonings.

Almost half of the recently awarded grants will assist first responders with projects such as upgrades to fire stations or the purchase of specialized firefighting gear, rescue tools and life-saving equipment.

To date, LCRA has awarded 1,967 community grants totaling more than \$50 million. When combined with more than \$234 million in community-raised matching funds, the program has invested almost \$285 million in local communities.

The grants include:

In Florence, a \$24,771 grant from LCRA and Pedernales Electric Cooperative will go to the Florence Volunteer Fire Department for a mobile crash barrier to protect the public and first responders at the sites of vehicle accidents.

In Goldthwaite, a \$25,000 grant from LCRA and the City of Goldthwaite will go to the Texas Botanical Gardens and Native American Interpretive Center for a rainwater catchment system to irrigate a native plant garden and highlight water-wise landscaping practices.

In Johnson City, a \$25,000 grant from LCRA and Pedernales Electric Cooperative will go to Lights Spectacular for electrical upgrades on the grounds of the Blanco County Courthouse to support the annual Lights Spectacular holiday display and other community events on the courthouse square.

In San Saba, a \$5,000 grant from LCRA and the City of San Saba will go to the San Saba County Historical Museum Foundation for an outdoor exhibit near the museum to illustrate the history and importance of water in the county.

CDPP grants are awarded twice a year for capital projects for volunteer fire departments, emergency responders, cities and counties, schools, libraries, civic groups, museums, and other tax-exempt nonprofit organizations. Applications for the next round of grants will be accepted during July at lcra.org/cdpp. Applications are due by midnight July 31.
