The National Weather Service says to look for another hot, humid day with high temperatures in the mid 90's. Tomorrow morning should be cloudy with the clouds burning off for the most part mid-morning. The hot, humid days are expected to continue through the middle of next week with the south winds bringing in the moisture. Look for the heat index to reach 100° and above beginning next week.

Today: Mostly sunny with a high near 92°. The wind will be S at 10-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Partly cloudy with a low near 71°. Winds will be S-SE at 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

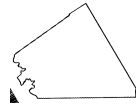
Friday: Partly sunny skies with a high temperature near 92°. Winds will be S at 5-10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Saturday Night: 72° with clear skies, and winds continuing from the S at 5-10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Rise in Lampasas COVID-19 Cases



Lampasas Radio was contacted yesterday by Dr. Georgia Hay concerning the uptick of corona virus cases in Lampasas County.

At 3pm yesterday we were notified of 2 additional cases in Lampasas County. They were household contacts of already positive cases. It is a man in his 40's and a female in her 60's. This morning, we were informed that there are 5 active cases, with more positive tests in our county likely forthcoming. No details are available yet on the new cases.

Here is a press release from Dr. Hay:

June 17, 2020

Dear fellow citizens of Lampasas County,

We are experiencing an increase in cases, both in our county and surrounding areas. As of Monday morning, we have 7 new cases in the past 72 hours, five of which are active. We are making our best effort to contact those exposed, but this is now much more prevalent in our community. I know many of us are "done with coronavirus", but I assure you it isn't done with us. We need to continue to practice safe physical distancing and limiting our

contacts. Wearing face masks really does help. It protects others from you if you have mild symptoms or no symptoms at all. We still recommend staying home if you are sick, but this is a very difficult disease due to the wide variety of symptoms. Many people think it's just allergies. I would encourage people to reach out to their doctor and get tested so we can track, trace, and protect the vulnerable people in our communities. We also have the risk of exposure at our workplaces that can affect a lot of people. Many people may live in another county where there may be more people with COVID-19, but work in Lampasas county. Your employers can contact me or Region 7 Health Department or the CDC website to help with recommendations on what to do. I do understand the need to work during these hard times, and I think some businesses have done this very successfully and kept their patrons and staff safe. We can learn from those businesses and apply those practices to our work and personal lives to move around as safely as possible. I do see this as everyone's responsibility to protect our community, families, and friends. I pray you all stay healthy.

Spring-Ho Update

Toughest 10K in Texas 5K & 1 Mile Fun Run 2020

After much consideration and to keep health and safety for everyone a top priority, it has been recommended by race organizers we cap registration for this years' race to 200 runners. Since runners travel nationwide to attend this race held during the Annual Lampasas Spring Ho Festival, we are also discouraging spectators for this event. The smaller number of attendees will allow for runners to run their races in smaller groups, while maintaining social distancing guidelines. Be assured, this decision was not made lightly. However, it was determined this was the best course of action at this time. Race organizers are taking all precautions to ensure the safety of runners and staff for the event. We feel by putting into place measures which coincide with CDC guidelines we will be able to host the event in a much safer environment. Capping the number of runners for this event; removing on-site registration, modifying the award presentation ceremony and water stop procedures will help limit interaction and touch points allowing for a cleaner, safer event.

While we can only make the recommendation, we are encouraging attendees to take the necessary measures to social distance, wear masks and to abide by CDC and event recommendations when attending this event.

The race begins at 7a.m. and will start and finish at the Hancock Park Golf Course Pavilion in Lampasas. The race will also feature a 5K and a 1 Mile Fun Run. Registration entry fees are \$15 (1 Mile Fun Run), \$25 (5K Run) and \$35 (10K Run). The entry fee increases \$5 per individual after June 24th (if spots are still available,) and T-shirts are limited past that date. Race-day

I'm sure you're wondering: how exactly did they come up with that? In short, it was 100% data-driven, utilizing a forecasted percentage of normalization.

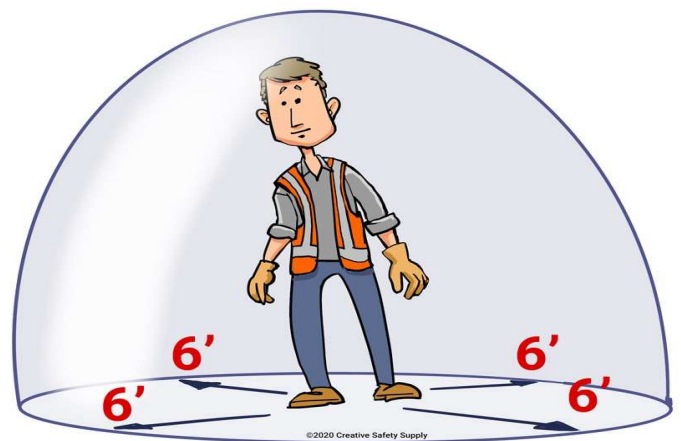
