Juneteenth Now a Federal Holiday

With President Joe Biden signing the "Juneteenth National Independence Day Act", which flew through the house and senate, with no opposing votes in the senate, earlier this week, we have another Federal Holiday. June 19th will be recognized as Juneteenth each year.

Juneteenth celebrations originated with the freed slaves in Galveston, Texas, on June 19^{th} 1865, about 2 ½ years after the

Emancipation Proclamation was signed. At first celebrated with church picnics and speeches, the holiday became more popular. Juneteenth was a State Paid Holiday in Texas, and now becomes the 11th Federal Holiday according to federalpay.org. It is the first Federal Holiday signed into existence since Martin Luther King day

While this is now a federal holiday, because of the short notice most places will be open for regular business. The Post office will deliver mail today and tomorrow, as they did not have enough time to cease operations. Most banks will be open as well. Locally, city offices will remain open, and County offices are as well.

2nd Amendment in Texas

Governor Greg Abbott yesterday signed seven pieces of legislation into law to protect Second Amendment Rights in Texas.

"Politicians from the federal level to the local level have threatened to take guns from law-abiding citizens — but we will not let that happen in Texas," said Governor Abbott. "Texas will always be the leader in defending the Second Amendment, which is why we built a barrier around gun rights this session. These seven laws will protect the rights of law-abiding citizens and ensure that Texas remains a bastion of freedom. Thank you to the Texas Legislature for getting these bills to my desk."

Senate Bill 19 prohibits any governmental entity from contracting with any business that discriminates against firearm and ammunition businesses or organizations. (cont'd on back)

Lampasas Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Thursday shows Lometa with an accident. Kempner shows reports of suspicious activity, animal/livestock issues, civil matters, a welfare check, reported criminal mischief, and a request for extra patrol. Out in the county there were medical calls, civil matters, a shots fired call, reports if suspicious activity, livestock issues and a reported disturbance. Deputies went into Cove on a welfare check and a medical call.

Senate Bill 20 allows guests to store firearms in their hotel rooms. Senate Bill 550 removes the shoulder or belt holster requirements, allowing Texans to carry firearms in whatever kind of holster they choose.

House Bill 957 repeals the criminal offense of possessing, manufacturing, transporting, or repairing a firearm silencer. It also ensures that any firearm suppressor manufactured in Texas, and that remains in Texas, will not be subject to federal law or federal regulation.

House Bill 1500 prevents any government entity from prohibiting the sale or transportation of firearms or ammunition during a declared disaster or emergency.

House Bill 1927 authorizes Constitutional Carry in Texas, meaning law-abiding Texans can legally carry a handgun without a license to carry.

House Bill 2622 makes Texas a Second Amendment Sanctuary State by protecting Texans from new federal gun control regulations.

Texas Workforce commission Assisting with child Care

WACO, TX — The Texas Workforce Commission will allow unemployed individuals the opportunity to enroll in the child care subsidy program, in order to provide adequate childcare for up to three months while they find employment. This is due to lack of child care being a major issue for unemployed individuals, according to TWC.

"TWC is committed to providing comprehensive services to help Texas job seekers connect to rewarding opportunities with Texas employers," said TWC Chairman Bryan Daniel. "I encourage Texas families to take advantage of the expanded availability of child care, as well as training and upskilling services through TWC, to pursue a career in Texas' exciting industries."

The child care subsidy program is funded by a federal grant and was originally only dedicated to working families or individuals who were either already employed or engaging in education, or training, before beginning employment.

TWC waived the rules for unemployed individuals, effective July 1 through September 30, 2022.

"Texas Workers have faced many challenges over the last year but getting back on their feet after so long has been particularly difficult," said TWC Commissioner Representing Labor Julian Alvarez. "This is a step we can take that preserves the focus of the program on working families, but provides help in that crucial job-search period."

Normally, parents in the program are assigned a copay based on their income. However, TWC will allow the copay to be waived for unemployed individuals until they find a job. It will then be reinstated based on the individual's income, after they are employed.

"Texas employers are rebounding from the pandemic and have job openings they are anxious to fill," said TWC Commissioner Representing Employers Aaron Demerson. "For some Texans looking for a job, child care is that last piece of the puzzle that will help them re-enter the workforce and this program is win-win situation for both the employers and employees."
