The Weather

The heat index yesterday was 100°.

Today: Partly sunny skies and a high temperature near 96°, with a heat index near 103°. No heat advisory was issued due to the short nature of the extreme heat index. Use caution when out in the heat and take frequent breaks. Wind will be S at 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Tonight: Look for increasing clouds with a low temperature near 74°, and S wind continuing at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Warning Placed on Some Covid Vaccines

WARNING

CBS news reports that the FDA on Wednesday said it plans to add a warning to Pfizer and Moderna vaccines after a CDC advisory panel said data suggests a "likely association" between the vaccines and rare cases of heart inflammation in adolescents and young adults. Despite the warning, doctors and researchers say they still strongly recommend that all Americans 12 and older get vaccinated, noting that the heart problems are uncommon and in most cases very mild.

The CDC tracked more than 1,200 cases of myocarditis, which is inflammation of the heart muscle, and pericarditis, which is inflammation of the outer lining of the heart. More than 800 of the cases occurred after the second dose, and 65% were linked to the

Pfizer vaccine. The largest share of the cases occurred in men under the age of 24, according to the report.

Symptoms of myocarditis include chest pains, heart palpitations and shortness of breath. But despite the risks of the condition, a new CDC report estimates the vaccines could prevent 5,700 COVID-19 cases and as many as 215 hospitalizations among boys aged 12-17, noting that the benefits of vaccinating that age group "still clearly outweigh the risks."

Meanwhile, vaccine hesitancy and the Delta variant continue to drive new COVID-19 cases in the country, with some areas only having 1 in 4 residents vaccinated.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court special Setting on May 7th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt. Altogether 5 cases were brought to the court with 4 cases involving men, and 1 case involving a woman. Jesse Salazar failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance/PG1/less than a gram, and prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

There were 2 cases involving possession of a controlled substance/PG1, and 1 case each for; prohibited substance in a correctional facility, evading arrest w/ vehicle or watercraft with serious bodily injury and possession of marijuana 4oz-5lbs.

All cases were rescheduled or set for jury trials.

LCRA Offering Grants

The Lower Colorado River Authority is offering grants of up to \$50,000 for community projects throughout LCRA's wholesale power, water and transmission service territory.

Applications for this round of Community Development Partnership Program grants will be available online beginning July 1 and must be submitted by midnight on July 31. Most grants are for \$25,000 or less, but several grants of up to \$50,000 are awarded each cycle.

Eligible organizations include volunteer fire departments, emergency responders, local governments, schools, libraries, civic groups, museums and other nonprofit organizations. The grants are not available to individuals, for-profit entities, professional associations, social service projects or limited-use facilities.

Applicants requesting more than \$5,000 in grant funding must supply matching funds of at least 20 percent of the total project cost. The projects must benefit or be available to an entire community and must improve the value of a capital asset by building, renovating or purchasing equipment.

Organizations in all or part of the following counties are eligible for CDPP grants: Aransas, Austin, Bandera, Bastrop, Blanco, Brown, Burtleson, Burnet, Caldwell, Callahan, Cameron, Coke, Coleman, Colorado, Comal, Concho, Coryell, Crane, Crockett, Culberson, DeWitt, Dimmit, Eastland, Ector, Edwards, Fayette, Gillespie, Goliad, Gonzales, Guadalupe, Hamilton, Harris, Hays, Hidalgo, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, Kimble, Kinney, Lampasas, Lavaca, Lee, Llano, Mason, Matagorda, Maverick, McCulloch, Medina, Menard, Midland, Mills, Nolan, Nueces, Pecos, Real, San Patricio, San Saba, Schleicher, Starr, Sterling, Sutton, Taylor, Terrell, Tom Green, Travis, Upton, Uvalde, Val Verde, Waller, Washington, Wharton, Williamson and Zavala.
