The Weather

High yesterday was 90° Low this morning was 72°



Scattered showers and storms are forecast for today, and temperatures should be similar to yesterday. The showers and storms are expected to taper off for tomorrow through the beginning of next week.

Today: Mostly cloudy skies and a 40% chance of showers with a high temperature near 88°. Winds will be south at 10- 15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Cloudy with a low near 73° and the 20% chance of showers close to midnight. Winds will be S-SE at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Saturday: Skies will be partly sunny with a high temperature near 92°. Winds will be S at 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Saturday night: Mostly cloudy with a low near 72°. Winds will be S near 15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Sunday: Mostly cloudy skies and a high temperature near 91°. There is a 20% chance of showers and storms. Wind will be S at 10-20 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Sunday night: Mostly cloudy with a low near 72° and a S wind near 15 mph with 25 mph gusts possible.

Workin' on the Springs



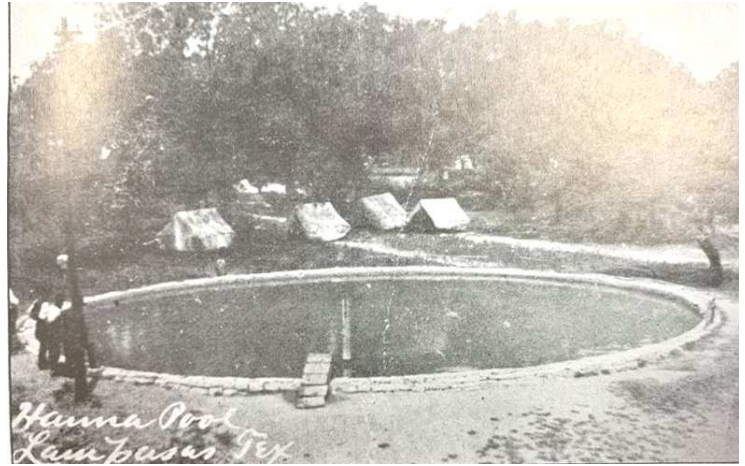
As a result of a joint effort of LAFTA, the Lampasas Parks Board, the Lampasas City Council and the Lampasas Heritage Foundation, we will soon see improvements at the springs in Campbell Park.

Removing the fence around the springs was the first step. We will be building wading pools below the spillway, bringing in concrete tables and benches, adding historic signage.

The Lampasas Heritage Foundation will be working on the pool tomorrow morning. This was on their social media, and we were asked to share:

“Now comes your part. On this coming Saturday, June 27, 9:00 a.m., we will be cleaning the algae off the top of the pool as well as scrubbing the spillway area. We invite you to come help! If you have a pool brush or long handled leaf rake, bring it. If you have a scrub brush, bring it. But most of all, we want you to come experience the fabulous water, if only briefly!

In addition to this initial cleaning we will be placing concrete tables and benches under the trees so people can enjoy a picnic around this very special part of Lampasas. A very special thanks to Tom Welch, Clay Harrington, and Alex and Christina Marez show have donated four of the tables. We hope to have two more donated by the taping of the television show, Daytripper, next Wednesday and Thursday.”



There are more enhancements ahead which will include wading pools for kids and adults to be able to enjoy the healing waters, historical signage, excavation of the foundation of the early 1900s bathhouse, a complete cleaning of the entire springs which will include removing debris from the bottom, and parking dedicated to the spring area.

Thank you to everyone who has helped and is continuing to help celebrate the birthplace of Lampasas - Hanna Springs.

Coronavirus Update

Lampasas Radio confirmed this morning with Lampasas County Health Authority, Dr. Georgia Hay that Lampasas County now has 23 cases of COVID-19. 11 active and 12 recovered.

Lampasas ISD Update

Dr. Chane Rascoe was in Lampasas Radio Studios this morning to discuss the upcoming school year. While the district is anticipating guidelines from TEA, as of now this is what parents need to know.

He expressed the concern of some students falling behind due to the COVID-19, and said the district will spend some time bringing students up to speed. School will start August 10th. The buses will be running.

He said it is crucial that all parents get these items for their child: A thermometer, parents need to check their child's temperature **every morning**. If your child has any fever at all, do NOT send them to school please! Protective masks/face coverings, and he advises to get several. Also send hand sanitizer with your child.

Dr. Rascoe stressed also that your child should know how to take his own temperature, use the mask and hand sanitizer, and how to wash their hands properly. At this time masks are recommended, not required, but Governor Abbott may change this.

The other subject he touched on was making sure everyone gets their flu shots early this year, to avoid any COVID complications.

If there is indirect contact, Dr. Georgia Hay will do the contact tracing for the school district. If there are cases of COVID in the schools, the district will look at the number of students affected

The Blotter.

Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Thursday shows an early morning criminal trespass in the 700 block of W. Ave E at 12:27am. The afternoon shows the arrest of Shannon Reid, 18, of Lampasas in the 400 block of E. 4th St. on an LPD warrant for assault/bodily injury/family violence/continuous. and take appropriate measures. He wants parents to understand he cannot give out any information about who has tested positive. If the number of students is large, the school will shut down, and Dr. Rascoe will advise parents at that time. At this time, there are no plastic shields in place due to space in classrooms. Lampasas ISD has multiple plans in place, however, 5-10 students in a classroom is outside the ability of Lampasas ISD.

In the next few weeks parents will receive an email, and parents need to respond if their student will be doing remote or in-class learning. Lampasas ISD **need to know this to coordinate!** If your child begins the school year remote learning, they may have to stay with that program for at least 9 weeks. (The same if they are attending school with the exception of being sick.)

Also very important---There will be no assemblies or large gatherings. Parents need to go to FAMILY ACCESS on the schools website and make sure the contact information is good. This is how you will receive your child's schedule, and if you are remote learning, the teacher will contact you through Parent Access.

Family Access will be open by July 22nd if not sooner. (For remote learning, there are 2 kinds, synchronous and asynchronous. **"Synchronous learning is online or distance education that happens in real time, whereas asynchronous learning occurs through online channels without real-time interaction."**

If your child is a remote student, there are time requirements necessary for attendance. Dr. Rascoe is also waiting on guidelines from TEA about this as well. Due to the internet capability around Lampasas, live-streaming does not work well. And, so far the Education Commissioner has offered no guidance for funding meals for remote students so Lampasas ISD is waiting for word on that as well.

Please keep Lampasas ISD in your thoughts and prayers.

Updates from Governor Abbott

**Limits Certain Businesses And Services
With Direct Link To Infections**

Governor Greg Abbott today issued an executive order limiting certain businesses and services as part of the state's efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19. This decision comes as the number of people testing positive for COVID-19 and the number of hospitalizations have increased and the positivity rate in Texas increased above 10%, which the Governor previously stated would lead to further preventative action. The targeted, measured directives in the executive order are based on links between certain types of businesses and services and the recent rise in positive cases throughout the state.

The order includes the following:

- All bars and similar establishments that receive more than 51% of their gross receipts from the sale of alcoholic beverages are required to close at 12:00 PM today. These businesses may remain open for delivery and take-out, including for alcoholic beverages, as authorized by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
- Restaurants may remain open for dine-in service, but at a capacity not to exceed 50% of total listed indoor occupancy, beginning Monday, June 29, 2020.
- Rafting and tubing businesses must close.

Outdoor gatherings of 100 or more people must be approved by local governments, with certain exceptions.

"As I said from the start, if the positivity rate rose above 10%, the State of Texas would take further action to mitigate the spread of COVID-19," said Governor Abbott. "At this time, it is clear that the rise in cases is largely driven by certain types of activities, including Texans congregating in bars. The actions in this executive order are essential to our mission to swiftly contain this virus and enhance public health. We want this to be as limited in duration as possible. However, we can only slow the spread if everyone in Texas does their part. Every Texan has a responsibility to themselves and their loved ones to wear a mask, wash their hands, stay six feet apart from others in public, and stay home if they can. I know that our collective action can lead to a reduction in the spread of COVID-19 because we have done it before, and we will do it again."
