Hamilton Man Murdered in Copperas Cove

From the Copperas Cove Police Dept. - On June 25, 2022 at approximately 1:14 AM, officers were dispatched to the 100 block of South 1st Street in reference to a male who sustained a severe laceration. Officers provided medical aid until the arrival of Copperas Cove EMS.

The victim, Hamilton resident Christian Carl Carrigan, was transported to Carl R. Darnall Army Hospital where he ultimately succumbed to his wounds.

A witness identified the suspect as Hamilton resident Timothy Robert Rea and advised he fled the area prior to the arrival of police. Officers located Rea in the 1900 block of North 1st Street with the murder weapon still in his possession. Rea refused to comply with the officers and had to be subdued with the use of a Taser. Rea was taken into custody and charged with Murder. Rea was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Guinn, who set his bond at \$1,000,000 for the charge of murder. The investigation is still ongoing.

More Baby Formula Arrives

Many parents can take a deep sigh in relief because over 150,000 pounds of baby formula arrived by cargo plane Sunday morning at Bush Intercontinental Airport in Houston yesterday.

The shipment arrived just before 7am supplying enough formula to fill 1.5 million bottles.

The increase in baby formula supply is part of "Operation Fly Formula, an initiative by President Joe Biden that began in May to combat formula shortages. The White House has been working to make formula more available as it has faced pressure from parents over supply and demand issues.

The Michigan plant run by Abbott is the largest domestic manufacturer of baby formula but shut down in February due to safety concerns.

The plant reopened on June 4 after the company committed to additional sanitizing and safety protocols, but closed again shortly after severe weather caused damage to the plant.
