The Weather



The High yesterday 90° The Low this morning 78

Another hot, humid and windy day is expected, and the heat and humidity have resulted in a heat advisory for our area. Heat indices could reach 105 °-108 ° this afternoon. However, the hottest days are expected to be Wednesday and Thursday. High temperatures along and west of 281 are expected to reach 100 °-102 °, combine those with the expected heat and you have oppressive heat. Be Safe!

Today: Mostly cloudy skies and a high temperature near 95°, with a heat index near 104°. Winds will be S near 15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Tonight: Increasing clouds with a slight chance of showers late in the evening. The low will be near 77°. Wind will be S at 10-15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

Wednesday: Mostly cloudy with gradual clearing and a high near 98°. The heat index is forecast to be near 104 °. Wind will be S at 10-15 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Wednesday Night: Partly cloudy with a low near 74°. Winds will continue at the S near 5-15 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Thursday: Mostly sunny with a high near 97° and a S wind at 5-10 mph.

Thursday Night: Partly cloudy with a low near 74° with winds from the S at 5-10 mph.

COVID-19 Update

Lampasas County Health Authority Dr. Georgia Hay contacted Lampasas Radio this morning and let us know there are **5 new cases** of covid-19 in Lampasas County.

In the state of Texas, 153,011 people have tested positive as of June 29th. That is 4,283 more than the day before and 38,130 more than a week ago.

Leaders in larger Texas cities are imploring Governor Abbott to either re-start the shelter in place order, or give local leaders the authority to do so. Travis county Judge Biscoe has asked Governor Abbott "to roll all the way back to Stay Home orders based on worsening circumstances," further cap business occupancy, mandate masks, and ban gatherings of 10 or more people.

While Lampasas County may not have the problems of more populated counties, we still need to follow the protocols of hand washing, using hand Sanitizer, social distancing and wearing a cloth mask when social distancing is not an option and stay home if you can.

When Lampasas Radio checked this morning, there were 32 ICU beds and 91 ventilators available in our Trauma Service Area. The counties in our Trauma area are: Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, and Mills.

District Court Notes



Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on June 26th. Presiding over the Court was 27th district Judge John Gauntt. Cornellius Dorsey failed to appear on the charge of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram and a warrant was issued for him.

Altogether 23 cases were brought to the court, 19 of them involved men and 4 involved women.

There were 7 cases involving possession of a controlled substance, 5 for under 1 gram, with one in a drug free zone, 1 case for possession 1-4 grams, and 1 for 4-200 grams.

Felony cases for theft or burglary numbered 4. There was 1 burglary of a habitation, 1 case for burglary of a building and 2 cases for burglary of vehicles with 2 or more convictions, those 2 cases with the same defendant.


There was 1 case for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. There was one case for debit/credit card abuse of the elderly, and two cases for debit/credit card abuse, as well as one case for engaging in organized criminal activity.

Crimes causing personal harm included 2 for aggravated assault, one for aggravated sexual assault of a child, one for invasive visual recording and one for indecency with a child/sexual contact.

Of the 23 cases presented to the court, 3 cases were settled with Joseph Shanks of Buckholts pleading guilty to two charges of possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram. Mr. Shanks was sentenced to 9 months state jail on each charge with sentences running concurrent and credit for days served. Javier Gutierrez pled guilty and was sentenced to 20 years in TDCJ with credit for time served, for his part in the murder of Vance Helzer.

The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

Beware of the Heat



During extremely hot and humid weather, your body's ability to cool itself is challenged. When the body heats too rapidly to cool itself properly, or when too much fluid or salt is lost through dehydration or sweating, body temperature rises and you or someone you care about may experience a heat-related illness. It is important to know the symptoms of excessive heat exposure and the appropriate responses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provides a list of warning signs and symptoms of heat illness, and recommended first aid steps. Some of these symptoms and steps are listed below.

Heat cramps may be the first sign of heat-related illness, and may lead to heat exhaustion or stroke.

Symptoms: Painful muscle cramps and spasms usually in legs and abdomen, heavy sweating.

What to do: Apply firm pressure on cramping muscles or gently massage to relieve spasm, give sips of water unless the person complains of nausea, then stop giving water. *(cont'd on back)*

The Blotter.

Lampasas Police Dept. blotter for Monday shows a suspicious vehicle in the 500 block of E. North at 4:33am. There was a reported fraud in the 700 block of S. Broad at 10:14am/ A minor accident happened in the 300 block of E. 4th St. at 2:38 pm, then a suspicious vehicle was reported in the 500 block of E. 6th St. at 3:24pm. There were two more minor accidents, one in the 400 block of Creek St. at 5:25pm and one in the 200 block of W. Ave B at 7:49pm.

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Monday shows Lometa with a medical call and a civil matter. Kempner shows animal issues, a welfare check, civil matters and a medical call. Out in the county there were medical calls, a reported abandoned vehicle, animal issues, civil matters, and 2 accidents. Deputies went into Cove on an accident, a reported theft and reported trespassings.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of 40 year old Johnny Ray Morris of Copperas Cove for sexual abuse of a child continuous victim under 14 years old.

**(There is no burn ban, however the county guidelines prohibit burning if the wind is 15 mph or greater)*

Heat Exhaustion symptoms are; Heavy sweating, weakness, cool/pale/clammy skin, fast/weak pulse, possible muscle cramps, dizziness, nausea or vomiting, fainting.

What to do: Move person to a cooler environment, lay person down and loosen clothing, apply cool/wet cloths to as much of the body as possible, fan or move victim to air conditioned room, offer sips of water.

*If person vomits more than once, seek immediate medical attention

Heat stroke symptoms are; Altered mental state, one or more of the following symptoms: throbbing headache, confusion, nausea, dizziness, shallow breathing. Body temperature above 103°F, hot, red, dry or moist skin, Rapid and strong pulse, faints, loses consciousness.

What to do: Heat stroke is a severe medical emergency. Call 911 or get the victim to a hospital immediately. Delay can be fatal. Move the victim to a cooler, preferably air-conditioned, environment. Reduce body temperature with cool cloths or bath.

Use fan *if heat index temperatures are below the high 90s*. A fan can make you hotter at higher temperatures.

Do NOT give fluids.

*To avoid any kind of heat illness, make sure you drink plenty of fluids, stay in an air-conditioned room, stay out of the sun, and check up on relatives and neighbors.

*Young children and pets should never be left unattended in vehicles under any circumstances.

*When possible reschedule strenuous activities to early morning or evening.

*Know the signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

* Anyone overcome by heat should be moved to a cool and shaded location.
