The Weather

The High yesterday 87° The Low this morning 71°

There was .01 in of rainfall Sunday morning about 10:30am at Lampasas Airport.

Today: A 30% chance of rain this morning, otherwise partly sunny, a high near 88° and south wind 5-10 mph.

Tonight: Mostly cloudy with a low around 71° and S-SE wind around 10 mph.

Tuesday: A 20% chance of afternoon rain, partly sunny and a high around 90° with south wind 5-10 mph.

Overnight, partly cloudy with a low around 72° and S-SE wind 10-15 mph.

Rest of the week: Wednesday will bring another 20% rain chance, a little cooler at 88° for the high, and south wind that will get up to 10-15 mph. Overnight it will continue to be windy and the temp will drop to 73°.

Celebrating the 4th of July

Copperas Cove Fireworks Ban – As Independence Day approaches the City of Copperas Cove would like to take an opportunity to remind citizens that Code of Ordinances Chapter 7, Article IV, Section 7-61 prohibits fireworks within the City limits. This ordinance will be strictly enforced by the Fire Department, Police Department and Code Compliance for the safety of our citizens.

The release above, from Gary Young, Cove's Emergency Management Coordinator and Asst. Fire Chief, goes on to explain that you cannot "manufacture, assemble, store, transport, receive, keep, sell, offer or have in such person's possession with intent to sell, use, discharge, cause to be discharged, ignite, detonate, fire or otherwise set in action any fireworks of any description within the City." Furthermore, you cannot sell, offer for sale, or store fireworks within 5,000 feet of the City of Copperas Cove.

Breach of any of the above could bring you \$200 fine!

Lampasas Fireworks Ban – The City of Lampasas also bans the use of fireworks within its limits. The sale of fireworks in certain areas is allowed by permit only. Breach of the rules here, could also bring you a fat fine.

Kempner City Hall reports that fireworks are banned within their City Limits.

Lometa City Hall says there is no restriction on fireworks, leaving it up to county rules, though there is to be some discussion in a City Council meeting about whether that should have a time limit of midnight or not.

*****What you can do... If you are within the County of Lampasas, but outside any of the City limits of Lampasas, Copperas Cove, Kempner, or Lometa, and thereby governed by County Rules and Regulations... you can discharge fireworks based on the County's rules and regulations. The County's rules this year say that you can discharge fireworks other than bottle (stick) rockets and fin-type rockets.**

District Court Notes

Lampasas Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on June 28th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 61 cases were brought to the court. 45 involved men and 16 involved women. There were 34 cases involving possession of a controlled substance. 24 for possession of PG1 less than a gram, 4 cases for possession of less than a gram in a drug free zone, 3 cases for possession of 1-4 grams, and 2 cases for possession of a controlled substance PG 1 4-200 grams. There was one case involving penalty group 2. There were 2 DWI cases. There were 4 cases involving burglary or theft, including theft of a controlled substance less than \$150,000, in which Mary Foley of Kempner was sentenced to 6 years deferred adjudication probation with a \$1,000 fine, and had to attend a SAFFP. Abelardo Carbajal of Austin saw his burglary of habitation case dismissed and was sentenced to 3 years TDCJ on bail jumping and FTA charges.

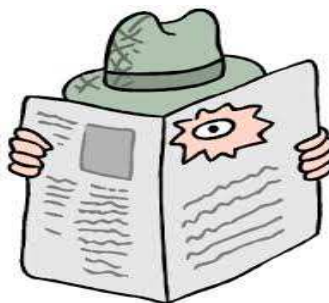

The Blotter



Lampasas Police Dept blotter for Sunday shows a reckless driver on N. 281 at 12:37am, and at 12:43am a 50 year old New Braunfels Man was arrested in the 300 block of 281 S. for DWI 2nd.

A disturbance was reported in the 100 block of E. Ave F at 2:07am, then later in the morning a 26 year old Round Rock woman was detained in the 100 block of E. 4th St. on a Williamson County warrant. At 10am, Sonia Prado Salinas, 21, of Lampasas was arrested for assault causing bodily injury/family violence in the 700 block of Old Georgetown Rd.

11:41 saw a disturbance in the 600 block of Old Georgetown Rd., then a reckless driver in the 800 block of N. Key at 12:49pm. There was a harassment in the 800 block of N. Ridge at 3:14pm, then another in the 700 block of E. Ave G at 3:49pm. A loud music complaint came in from the 1300 block of W. Ave C at 6:12pm, then an assault in the 400 block of N. Ridge at 8:05pm. A suspicious person was reported in the 1300 block of E. Ave I at 11:47pm

The Lampasas County Sheriff's Dept blotter for the weekend shows Lometa responded to a report of suspicious activity, a medical call and a reported runaway. Kempner had reports of suspicious activity, requested extra patrol a theft and animal problems. Out in the county there were animal issues, suspicious activity, civil matters and an accident. Deputies went into Cove on a report of an abandoned vehicle, medical calls, an accident and reported reckless drivers.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of a 37 year old Victoria man for nonpayment of child support, and 28 year old Aaron Schoch of Leander for failure to appear.

Lampasas Fire Dept. and other emergency services worked a one vehicle rollover (truck) on FM 580E on Saturday afternoon. It took place about 1pm, 4 mi. east of Lampasas, and there were no serious injuries involved.

(cont'd from front) There were 3 cases for unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, one in which Alex Keel of Gatesville was sentenced to 180 days state jail plus costs and fees with credit for time served. There was one forgery case and one for credit/debit card abuse. There was one case involving a prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

There were 5 cases involving assault, one for hindering capture of a fugitive, and one for evading arrest. Sex crimes included aggravated sexual assault of a child, failure to register as a sex offender and two cases of indecency with a child by sexual contact.

Of the 61 cases presented to the court, 14 cases were settled. Brett Sample, of Waynoka Oklahoma was punished with 4 years deferred adjudicated probation plus costs fees & a \$500 fine for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. Jonathan Friedlander of Lampasas saw his probation revoked and was sentenced to 4 years TDCJ and one year state jail on 2 separate charges of possession of a controlled substance PG1 1-4 grams and one charge of possession of a controlled substance less than a gram. Shannon Dowis was sentenced to 15 months state jail for possession of a controlled substance less than a gram in a drug free zone.

The following were sentenced on possession of a controlled substance PG1 less than a gram:

Melvin Batiste of Copperas Cove 3 years deferred adjudicated probation; Derrick Cunningham 3 years deferred adjudicated probation with \$1000 fine plus costs & fees; Steve Moreno of Lampasas 12 months state jail plus costs & fees with credit for time served. Michael Westbrook and Michael Erickson were each sentenced to 2 days in the Lampasas County Jail with credit for time served plus costs & fees.

Naomi Ganaha of Round Rock saw her probation revoked and was punished to 2 years TDCJ with credit for time served for prohibited substance in a correctional facility.

The balance of the cases were reset or had trials set to some future date.
