Thursday: Sunny and hot with a high temperature near 101°. Winds will be S-SW at 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Thursday Night: Mostly clear skies with a low near 76°. Winds will be S-SE at 5-10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Friday: Skies will be sunny with the temperature topping out near 103°. Wind will be S-SW near 5 mph.

Friday Night: Mostly clear skies and the low will be near 79°. Winds will be S-SE near 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.


Annual Hayloft Party a Success

Spring Ho Continues

Today started off with the Kiddie Fishing Derby at 8am at WM Brook Park, with lots of prizes in each age group. The County Fair Registration begins at 4pm on Wednesday at the County Annex Building and goes to 7pm for those County Fair entries.



This evening bring us Gospel night at the Ruth Eakin Outdoor Theater beginning at 7pm and broadcast by KACQ 101.9FM. Following Gospel Night, as every year, is the Fireworks Display brought to you by HEB and Pyrotecnico, and will be broadcast on KACQ 101.9FM as well.

Tomorrow morning at 9:45am begins the Judging of the County Fair Exhibits, and the doors will be open to view the exhibits from 3-5:30pm. Thursday also brings the vendors and concessions at WM Brook Park. The carnival will be having a wristband night for \$20, and 7pm will bring the Dance Contest at Putters and Gutters.

Friday looks to be a busy Spring-Ho day with things getting started early in the morning with the 8:30am Diaper Derby. Registration for the Pet Parade begins at 8:30am, followed by the Judging at 9am and the Pet Parade to start at 9:30am. KACQ 101.9 will be broadcasting these events. The County Fair Exhibits will be open from 10am-2pm and the Lampasas County Museum will be open from 10am-4pm. The Lampasas County Museum has an exhibit titled 'Freedom Rang in Lampasas: Operation Long Horn 1952'. The vendors will be in WM Brook Park all day Friday. Friday night the Bellamy Brothers will be playing the downtown square in Lampasas for the Friday Spring Ho Concert on the Square with the local Drew Fish Band starting off the night.

Saturday starts out with the Toughest 10K in Texas, 5K and 1 Mile Run 2022. Registration is from 5:30-6:30am and the races start at 7am at the Hancock Park Golf Course Pavilion. 10am Saturday brings the Annual Spring Ho Grand Parade with Parade Marshals Dick & Pat Parker. The afternoon has the washer pitching and Cornhole Tournaments at the Gavin Garrett Soccer Field with 11am registration and 12 noon start times. There will be the Annual Kayak Races at WM Brook Park with 11:45 registration and 12pm start. And the Water Sports and Cardboard Regatta take place at the Hanna Springs Pool beginning at 3pm. Saturday night's Concert on the Square will begin with Carson Jeffrey followed by Mike Ryan. Vendors will be available in WM Brook Park all day.

Heat Related Illness

All of Central Texas is under a Heat Advisory until Friday Evening, and it may be extended.

During extremely hot and humid weather, your body's ability to cool itself is challenged. When the body heats too rapidly to cool itself properly, or when too much fluid or salt is lost through dehydration or sweating, body temperature rises and you or someone you care about may experience a heat-related illness. It is important to know the symptoms of excessive heat exposure and the appropriate responses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provides a list of warning signs and symptoms of heat illness, and recommended first aid steps. Some of these symptoms and steps are listed below. 

Savings Dwindling for Americans



Americans are starting to dip into the huge pile of savings they accumulated over the first two years of the pandemic. From the start of the pandemic to the end of 2021, U.S. households built up \$2.7 trillion in extra savings, according to Moody's Analytics. Covid-19 lockdowns kept people at home with nowhere to spend money, and three rounds of stimulus payments boosted their incomes.

Now, with inflation at its highest point in decades and wage gains trailing behind, Americans are turning to that stash to cover costs.

The personal saving rate, a measure of how much money people have left over after spending and taxes, reached 5.4% in May. That figure is below the average of the last decade and far below the record of 34% in April 2020, according to the Bureau of Economic Analysis. Families have tapped about \$114 billion of their pandemic savings so far, according to Moody's Analytics, which analyzed government data.

"Most households have a cash cushion to navigate through the very high inflation," said Mark Zandi, Moody's Analytics chief economist. "This is allowing consumers to stay in the game."

(cont'd from front) Heat cramps may be the first sign of heat-related illness, and may lead to heat exhaustion or stroke. Symptoms: Painful muscle cramps and spasms usually in legs and abdomen and Heavy sweating.

First Aid: Apply firm pressure on cramping muscles or gently massage to relieve spasm. Give sips of water unless the person complains of nausea, then stop giving water. Seek immediate medical attention if cramps last longer than 1 hour.

Heat Exhaustion symptoms: Heavy sweating, Weakness or tiredness, cool, pale, clammy skin; fast, weak pulse, muscle cramps, dizziness, nausea or vomiting, headache, fainting,

First Aid: Move person to a cooler environment, preferably a well air conditioned room. Loosen clothing. Apply cool, wet cloths or have person sit in a cool bath. Offer sips of water. Seek immediate medical attention if the person vomits, symptoms worsen or last longer than 1 hour.

Heat Stroke Symptoms: Throbbing headache, confusion, nausea, dizziness, body temperature above 103°F, hot, red, dry or damp skin, rapid and strong pulse, fainting, loss of consciousness.

First Aid: Call 911 or get the victim to a hospital immediately. Heat stroke is a severe medical emergency. Delay can be fatal. Move the victim to a cooler, preferably air-conditioned, environment. Reduce body temperature with cool cloths or bath. Use fan if heat index temperatures are below the high 90s. A fan can make you hotter at higher temperatures. Do NOT give fluids.

*Using a fan to blow air in someone's direction may actually make them hotter if heat index temperatures are above the 90s.
