Today: Sunny skies with a high temperature near 100°. Wind will be S-SW at 5-10 mph gusting to 20 mph.

Tonight: Look for mostly clear skies and down to about 76° over-night. Wind will be S-SE at 5-10 mph with possible gusts of 20 mph.

Friday: Sunny skies with a high temperature near 101°. Wind will become SW at 5-10 mph.

Fields and KACQ will be broadcasting from there. The vendors will be in WM Brook Park all day Friday. Friday night the Bellamy Brothers will be playing the downtown square in Lampasas for the Friday Spring Ho Concert on the Square with the local Drew Fish Band starting off the night.

Saturday starts out with the Toughest 10K in Texas, 5K and 1 Mile Run 2022. The afternoon has the washer pitching and Cornhole Tournaments at the Gavin Garrett Soccer Field with 11am registration and 12 noon start times. There will be the Annual Kayak Races at WM Brook Park with 11:45 registration and 12pm start. And the Water Sports and Cardboard Regatta take place at the Hanna Springs Pool beginning at 3pm. Saturday night's Concert on the Square will begin with Carson Jeffrey followed by Mike Ryan.

Sunday from 1-4pm brings the West(ern) Side Story celebrating the past present and future of Western Ave. Historic buildings will be open for touring, there will be Food Trucks available for eating, music for listening and dancing and vintage cars for riding.

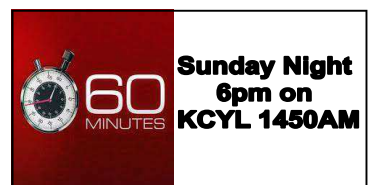

Texas 4-H Congress

Texas 4-H Youth Development Program announces Texas 4-H Congress to be held in Austin at the State Capitol July 17-20, 2022. Texas 4-H Congress is a four-day mock legislative experience for 4-H members in grades 9th to 12th where 4-H members assume the roles of legislators, lobbyists, and press corps to gain a first-hand understanding of how the legislative process works. Each participant writes and submits their own bill to be taken through the legislative process that week. Bills that are written and sponsored by 4-H members focus on issues concerning Texas and Texas youth.

Texas 4-H Congress is held every two years for senior-level 4-H members who are selected through their District to attend the event. The 2020 event was canceled due to COVID-19, so the 2022 event will be the first one held in four years.

The four-day event begins on Sunday with delegate meetings at the Sheraton Austin Hotel. The event will move into the Capitol Monday and Tuesday for sessions.

"Texas 4-H Congress is the event where 4-H members learn about the governmental processes by writing and debating bills. Of course, the goal is to have your specific bill reach the office of the 4-H Governor so that it could become "law." This mock legislative event is a great way for experiential learning to happen at its finest," Texas 4-H Youth Development Program Director, Montza Williams said. "Tackling issues that are important to the membership and having the opportunity to discuss those issues with people who may or may not agree with you is a skill that every person needs to learn. These youth are our future, and we will be better off as they learn more about how government works." Allison Martin will be representing Lampasas County in the role of a delegate.

Gas Prices

Wholesale gas prices are falling, but experts are warning Americans about getting too excited ahead of the summer driving season.

"Domestic gasoline demand dipped recently, which took some of

the pressure off of pump prices. About 80% of stations are now selling regular for under \$5 a gallon," AAA spokesperson Andrew Gross said in a Tuesday blog post. He continued, "But July is typically the heaviest month for demand as more Americans hit the road, so this trend of easing prices could be short-lived."

Over the past week, the national average of gasoline fell to \$4.80 a gallon, four cents less than a month ago, AAA added. In June, gas prices peaked at a \$5 record high as increased demand outpaced already tight global supply.

On Tuesday, Bloomberg's Steven Dennis reported that prices were down nearly 30 cents—a figure that falls in line with what Neil Dutta, head of economics at research firm Renaissance Macro, projected to Axios last week.

Texas and Delaware have seen the nation's largest weekly decreases in gas prices, with a decrease of 13 cents per gallon, according to AAA. Other states that have seen the greatest fall in fuel prices are Arizona, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, South Carolina, Florida, Virginia and Maryland.

South Carolina's 11-cent decrease has the state leading the pack as the least expensive market in the nation. Gas is also less expensive in Georgia, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, Texas, Alabama, Tennessee, North Carolina and Oklahoma.
