The Weather



High yesterday was 100° Low this morning was 75°
Heat Advisory in effect for Lampasas County through Sunday evening.

The heat index topped out at 106° in the 4pm-5pm time frame, and the heat index did not drop below 100° until 8:30pm. Today saw a warm and humid start, and this afternoon the heat will be oppressive. The heat index is expected to reach 105° pretty much area wide. The warmest temperature readings will be in the areas west of I-35, where the actual temperatures are expected to reach 103°-105°. The heat advisory will likely be re-issued for Monday and Tuesday.

Today: Sunny skies with S-SW winds near 5-10 mph. The high temperature will be near 100°.

Tonight: Mostly clear with S-SE winds near 5-10 mph. The low will be near 76°.

Sunday: Sunny and hot with a high temperature near 105° and a S winds at 5-10 mph.

Sunday Night: Mostly clear with a low temperature near 79° and S wind near 5-10 mph.

Monday: Skies will be mostly sunny with the high temperature near 105°. Winds will be S-SW at 5-10 mph.

Monday Night: A low near 78° and mostly clear skies. Wind will be S at 10 mph with gusts as high as 20 mph.

Spring-Ho 10K,5K and 1K

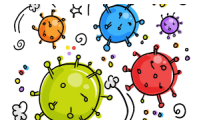

Covid-19 Update



Dr. Georgia Hay confirms this morning that Lampasas County has a total of 64 covid-19 cases, with 30 active (1 in the hospital) and 34 recovered. This is county-wide.

Texas reported 9,765 new cases yesterday. There were 10,002 Texans hospitalized as of yesterday as well. This is 2350 more than 1 week ago. These patients occupy 17.4% of hospital beds in Texas.

Early Voting



Early voting for the Democratic Primary Runoff has ended. The election will be this Tuesday, July 14th. 227 residents of Lampasas cast their ballots early.

The election is the runoff between MJ Hegar and Royce West. The winner will take on incumbent John Cornyn in November.

The other race on the ballot is the democratic runoff for Texas Railroad Commissioner. Roberto Alonzo and Chrystal Castaneda are facing off in that race. The winner of that runoff will face Ryan Sitton for one of the 3 seats on the Texas Railroad Commission.

Residents can vote on Tuesday from 7am to 7pm at either the New Covenant Church at 1604 CTE in Lampasas, or the Kempner Fire Dept. Training Center at 315 S. Pecan in Kempner. Questions should be directed to The County Election Office at 512.556.8271.

District Court Notes

Lampasas County Courthouse was the site of a 27th District Court Docket Call on July 10th. Presiding over the Court was 27th District Court Judge John Gauntt.

Altogether 25 cases were brought to the court, 22 of them involved men and 3 involved women.

There were 4 cases involving possession of a controlled substance, 2 for under 1 gram, and 2 cases for possession 1-4 grams.

Felony cases for theft or burglary numbered 4. There was 1 case for theft of a firearm, one for burglary of a building, and 2 cases for burglary of vehicles with 2 or more convictions, those 2 cases with the same defendant.

There was 1 case for evading arrest/detention with a motor vehicle. There was one case for debit/credit card abuse, as well as one case for engaging in organized criminal activity. There was also a case for illegal dumping.

Crimes causing personal harm included 4 for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, and 5 cases for assault on a family/household member. There was one case for abandonment/endangerment of a child, and one case for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon.

There was one case for sexual assault, and one for aggravated sexual assault of a child. (cont'd on back)

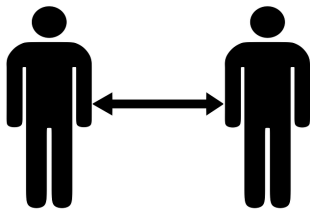

The Blotter.

The Lampasas Police Dept. Blotter for Friday shows a suspicious vehicle in the 1200 block of CTE at 2:13am, then a suspicious person in the 600 block of E. Ave F at 7:30am. A possession of drug paraphernalia was reported in the 700 block of W. 1st St. at 9:43pm.

The Sheriff's Dept. Blotter for Friday shows Lometa with a livestock issue. Kempner shows a medical call, a sex offense, a request for extra patrol and a welfare check. Out in the county, there was a report of an open door/gate, civil matters, and a medical call. Deputies went into Cove on a report of suspicious activity.

The Jail Log shows the arrest of Chayo Boy Rendon, 30, of Lampasas on 2 bond revocations and 3 outstanding fines.

Of the 25 cases presented to the court, 3 cases were settled with Heather Seevers of Lampasas pleading guilty to abandon/endanger child/criminal negligence. Ms. Seevers received 5 years probation plus court costs and fines. Saul Rodriguez of Killeen plead true to aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, and possession of a controlled substance PG1 4-200 grams. For these charges, Mr. Rodriguez will continue with probation and attend a SAFPF for treatment as a sanction. The remainder of the cases were reset or had trials set for a future date.

Texas Teachers and COVID-19

(The Texas Tribune) Under the guidelines Texas education officials released Tuesday, schools will be required to offer five days of in-person instruction per week, forcing some school superintendents to ditch plans they had already created hoping to keep families and teachers safe during the pandemic.



But the state's public health guidance does not give teachers an avenue to opt out like parents can, and says little about how school districts should protect the teachers and staff who are more vulnerable than children to dying from the virus — leaving those decisions largely up to locals.

Those decisions will largely be made by local school boards and superintendents, but pressure from Republicans — from President Donald Trump on down — to get back to business has teachers feeling left out of the planning process.

Particularly galling for some teachers is the TEA's own behavior. Even as the agency compels teachers back to the classroom, its own offices remain all-but-closed with most staff working from home to protect their own health. As of July, agency staff have had the option to return to the office building on a “voluntary basis” and the TEA is working on next steps for “later this summer and beyond,” according to a written statement from the agency.

“So after we return to school what then? The teacher or student should stay home to avoid infecting others, right? Well, a few things to consider:

1. Many times the kids are asymptomatic so they will be spreading germs unknowingly.
2. Many kids already come to school sick, sometimes dosed with medicine to mask fevers and symptoms, because parents have to get to work. How do we monitor this?
3. The symptoms of COVID are very similar to the symptoms that young children exhibit throughout the fall, winter, and spring due to common cold or allergies. And if teachers and students really stayed home every time they had a cough or symptom, they would probably be absent more than present. So do we have to ignore certain symptoms? Please clarify which symptoms are okay.
4. Staff are likely to have increased absences due to self-monitoring symptoms. Are they going to have substitutes for their classes? Substitutes can already be extremely hard to find. If we do find a sub- what germs are they bringing in? Where have they been? If they test positive do all schools they have been subbing at have to quarantine?
5. If a teacher or student tests positive for COVID, who quarantines? The entire class? The school building? Do we use sick days for this or is it unpaid? Do we switch to remote learning during the quarantine? Who is teaching the remote learning if the teacher is unable to work due to having the COVID that he/she caught at school?”
