Landowners in Central Texas can apply now for grants to help reduce risks posed to their properties by wildfire.

The State Fire Assistance for Mitigation – Mechanical Fuels Grant offers financial assistance to landowners to reduce fuels at high-risk for wildfire by using mechanical fuel reduction practices.

“These grants will be used to protect high-risk communities by reducing their risk of catastrophic wildfire through fuel reduction,” said Victoria Wenkman, Texas A&M Forest Service Fuels Program Specialist. “Putting in fuel breaks and reducing fuels on property can reduce a wildfire’s behavior and spread, potentially saving lives and property.” *(cont'd on back)*

The Lampasas Police Dept. The afternoon shows suspicious activity reported in the 500 block of S. Arnold St. at 1:45pm, there was a minor accident in the 400 block of S. Key Ave. at 3:44pm, and suspicious activity was reported in the 1100 block of E. Ave E at 6:06pm. There was a report of disorderly conduct reported in the 200 block of N. Walnut St. at 8:09pm, a suspicious vehicle was reported in the 600 block of N. Key Ave. at 10:50pm and there was a noise complaint in the 900 block of S. Walnut St. at 10:57pm. (cont'd from front) Fuel breaks are a removed section of vegetation that can decrease intensity of fires, protect first responders by giving them wide access lanes and slow incoming wildfires. "A fuel break can also benefit native vegetation and wildlife, allowing for shaded fuel breaks where large native trees remain and smaller invasive species are removed," said Wenkman.

Funding will be provided to private landowners for reimbursement costs associated with hand-cut fuel breaks using chainsaws or mechanical mulching using mechanical brush cutters, forestry mulchers and similar pieces of equipment.

Thirty-two counties in Central Texas are eligible for funding of actual costs not to exceed \$750 per acre for hand-cut fuel breaks or \$2,000 per acre for mulched fuel breaks. The maximum reimbursement for either method is \$10,000.

Priority will be given to landowners who live within the designated counties, are situated to protect the most homes and values, are located in a county or city that has an active Community Wildfire Protection Plan or live within a Firewise USA® Site.

After the application deadline, submissions will be ranked and approval or denial letters will be sent by September 30, 2022. If approved, applicants have 90 days to contract and complete the fuel break work.

Dark-Sky Friendly Lighting

Modern Society requires outdoor lighting for a variety of needs, including safety and commerce. The International Dark Sky Alliance (IDA) recognizes this and advocates that any required lighting be used wisely. Good lighting fixtures are essential, and their installation and use is also important. If outdoor light is necessary, follow these guidelines to prevent or minimize light pollution:

1. Useful. All light should have a clear purpose, how it impacts wildlife and environment. Consider reflective paints or self luminous markers as alternatives.
2. Targeted. Direct light only to where needed, use shielding and aiming to target light beam down, below horizontal so no light escapes into the night sky.
3. Low Light Levels. Light should be no brighter than needed.
4. Controlled. Limit use of light to when useful, consider timers, motion detectors, dimmers.
5. Color. Use warm color lights where possible, limit shorter wavelength (blue violet).

Try to find Dark Sky Friendly Lighting. IDA's fixture seal of approval certifies Dark Sky Friendly outdoor lighting fixtures, meaning that they minimize night sky pollution, glare and light trespass on to adjacent areas. All approved products are fully shielded and minimize the amount of blue light in the night time environment.
